BISHOP DANDRIDGE AT CHRIST CHURCH SUNDAY

The Rt. Rev. E. P. Dandridge, Bishop Coadjutor of Tennessee, will be at Christ Church Sunday evening to preach and to administer Confirmation. The service will be at 7:30 p. m.

DR. CLIFFORD STANLEY HERE NEXT SUNDAY

The Rev. Clifford L. Stanley, S.T.D., will spend four days in the Diocese of Tennessee next week conducting conferences at Memphis, Chattanooga, Knoxville, Nashville and Sewanee. He will be in Nashville Thursday, December 4.

Dr. Stanley is speaking under the auspices of the Diocesan Department of Christian Social Service. His general theme is "The Church and the Social Crisis Today and Tomorrow." Dr. Stanley is a former professor of Virginia Theological Seminary, and Dr. Reinhold Niebuhr of New York has referred to him as one of the two ablest young theologians in America. He will use the Malvern Manifesto as the starting point for his presentation and discussion. On Thursday morning Dr. Stanley will speak to the Episcopal clergy of the Nashville area; in the afternoon he will speak to the clergy of the various churches of the city and at seven-thirty in Christ Church Parish House, there will be a meeting for all who desire to attend. It is sincerely hoped that many of our people will avail themselves of this splendid opportunity.

WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO ELECT OFFICERS

All women of Christ Church should keep in mind and plan to attend, the general meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary at noon Monday (12:15). There are several important matters on the program, one of the main ones being the election of general officers of the Auxiliary. These officers being elected for a period of two years. 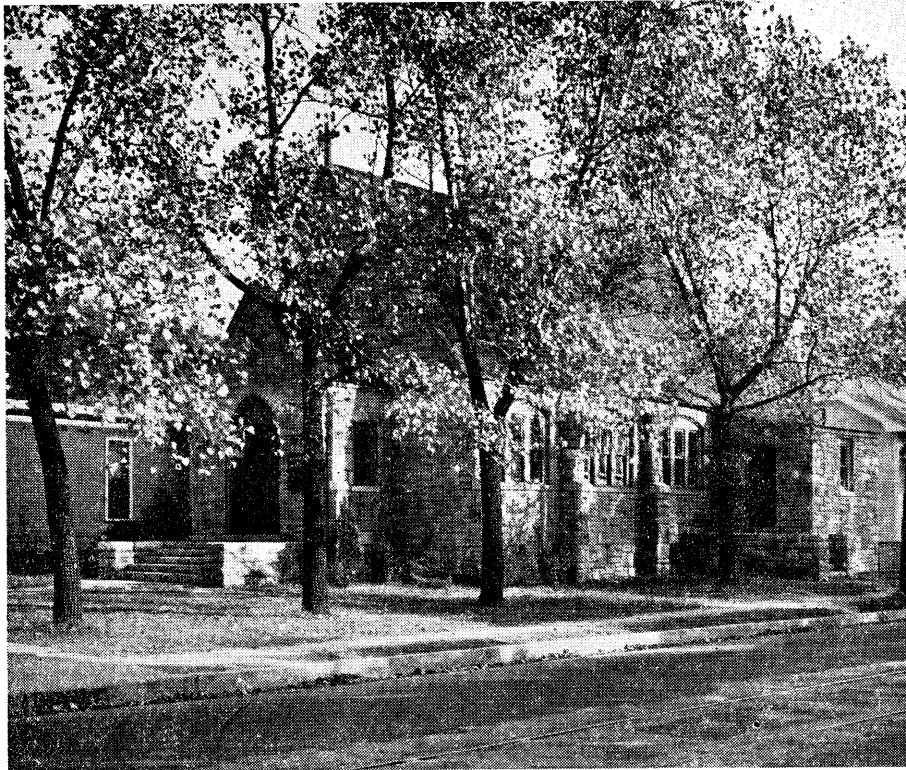
