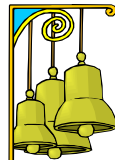

From The Youth Pastor...

“Do You Renew Your Commitment to Jesus Christ?” (BCP, p. 303)

In the churches of my teen years, this question was posed at nearly every Sunday service. Only, we didn't call it “renewing our commitment to Jesus Christ.” We called it “gettin' right with God” or “turning your life over to the Lord.” After a sermon reminding us that Jesus had given his life on the cross for us, we were invited to respond by making a similar gift to him: “Jesus died for you. What will you do for him?” The congregations of my evangelical upbringing were reminded of this exchange every time they gathered for worship – His life for ours – and they were invited to give their lives to Jesus on a weekly basis.

All of this may seem a bit strange to Episcopalian ears. But it shouldn't. After all, this invitation to give our lives to Jesus is the heart of the Confirmation rite. At Baptism our parents or sponsors made these promises on our behalf: That we would accept Jesus Christ as Savior, put our whole trust in his grace and love, and promise to follow and obey him as our Lord (BCP, p. 302-303). Confirmation puts those promises in our hands. No longer relying on another's answer, we are invited publicly to affirm our acceptance,

trust and loyalty. We freely, of our own accord, give our lives to him. In the churches of my youth, this act of self-giving was accomplished by the ritual of the “altar call.” After the sermon, and after a moment of silent prayer, those who would give themselves to Jesus responded by rising from their pews and walking to the front of the church to kneel at the altar rail.

Could there be anything more familiar to an Episcopalian? Isn't there an “altar call” every Sunday in our church? If you've missed it, listen again to the words of the Eucharistic Prayer of Rite I: “We earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby *we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies*” (BCP, p. 342) We come to the Altar every week, not only to receive the Body of Christ, but to offer “our selves, our souls and bodies” to the Lord.

The rite of Confirmation simply makes this exchange of gifts more explicit, and the promises of the Baptismal Covenant help us to understand what is meant by “offering our selves” to Jesus as Savior and Lord.

Giving our lives to Jesus means that we will “continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and

in the prayers.” It means that we will “persevere in resisting evil” and “repent and return to the Lord” when we fail. Giving our lives to Jesus means that we will be people who “proclaim by word and example the Good News,” and “seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving [our] neighbor as [our]selves.” Offering our lives to Jesus means that we are called to “strive for justice and peace among all people,” and to “respect the dignity of every human being.” (BCP, p. 304-305)

Giving our lives to Jesus at Confirmation is a high calling, a demanding calling, asking of us everything that we can give. But it is also an experience of Grace. For as the Bishop lays his hands on our heads he prays, “Strengthen, O Lord, your servant with your Holy Spirit; empower her for your service; and sustain her all the days of her life” (BCP, p. 309). This Holy Spirit, received in Baptism, is the same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead (Rom. 8:11) and now empowers us to live “no longer for ourselves but for Him who died and rose again for us” (2 Cor. 5:15).

May God bless you as you are confirmed!

Holy Week Notes

General

Meetings

In order to honor the solemnity of Holy Week, the Dean has asked that all administrative meetings of the Cathedral be rescheduled for other times during the month of April. This announcement is inclusive of all staff, Vestry, Cluster, and committee meetings of the Cathedral.

Confession

Throughout Lent and Holy Week, priests of the Cathedral will be available by appointment (and on Thursdays in the Chapel from 11 a.m. -12 noon) for those seeking to make a Confession according to the form *Reconciliation of a Penitent* as listed on page 447 of the *Book of Common Prayer, 1979*. Also, during Holy Week, a priest will sit inside the altar rail in the Cathedral Chapel between 11 a.m. and 12 p.m., Monday through Wednesday, for those who wish to make unscheduled Holy Week confessions.

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday Passion Walk Parishioners of all ages are invited to join in the Palm Sunday Passion Walk during the Sunday school hour. Each stop along the walk features a different Holy Week event.

Maundy Thursday

A Vigil with the Blessed Sacrament—Good Friday is the one day in the Church Year when the Holy Eucharist is not celebrated, as the Church mourns the death of the Messiah. But so as not to be denied the benefits of his passion in the Sacrament, the tradition arose wherein the faithful kept vigil with the consecrated Bread and Wine from Maundy Thursday night until the time of its distribution on Good Friday (Mass of the Pre-Sanctified, see the *Book of Common Prayer, 1979, p. 282*). In order to facilitate this Vigil, the Cathedral Chapel will be prepared with an Altar of Repose (for the Reserved Sacrament) following the Stripping of the

Altar on Maundy Thursday. A sign-up list is available at the Reception desk asking you to sign up for a one-hour vigil sometime during the night. Three people are asked to keep vigil at each hour. Volunteers at the Reception desk will let those in who come during the night for prayer. Silence is kept throughout the vigil. Candles may be lit at the close of one's time of prayer. Devotional resources for the hour will be made available in the Chapel, though the classical practices of Centering and Contemplative prayer are frequently employed by those keeping vigil.

Good Friday

The Good Liturgy

This year's Good Friday Liturgy will be offered at 12 noon only, so as to have the Cathedral's gathering conform more closely to the historical hour of the crucifixion. The liturgy will include the Liturgy of the Word, Sermon, the Solemn Collects, the Veneration of the Cross, the Reproaches, and Communion from the Reserved Sacrament.

Flowering of the Cross—On Easter morning a large wooden cross suitable for "flowering" will be placed at the top of the stairs by the handicapped access ramp exit to the side parking lot door. Bring flowers with you when you come to worship on Easter Day—something local, something from your garden—and place them in the cross. Whether before you worship or after (7 a.m., 8:30 a.m., or 11 a.m.) stop by and watch the cross grow flush with the colors of Christ's Resurrection!
