From the Dean

Thou hast clothed us with skin and flesh, thou hast fenced us with bones and sinews; thou hast granted us life and favor, And thy visitation preserves our spirit.

> The Reverend Matthew Henry A Method for Prayer with Scriptural Expressions, 1710

Rarely have I made proper use of a plumb-bob. I've built a piece of furniture or two (after the fashion of *This End Up* furniture). I've built a tree house in a backyard, but as the crooked wall demonstrated, without the benefit of a plumb-bob. I held one once, assisting carpenters trying to piece a house back together after Hurricane Fran. Holding one isn't exactly using one, but in the holding my interest was piqued.

The carpenter asked me to climb the ladder and drive a small nail into the wall just below the crown molding. A plumb-line was hung from the nail. At the other end of the line, the plumb-bob, a pointed, leaden weight, just touched the ground and steadied the line. The carpenter snapped the chalky plumb-line against the wall, marking it with a straight line from top to bottom. This is no news to those who frame houses and otherwise concern themselves with solid foundations. But to one more accustomed to books than hammers, this essential tool helped interpret the mysteries of square corners and lines perpendicular to the ground.

By no accident was our Lord's earthly father a carpenter. Joseph's skilled hand would have daily enacted Amos' prophetic vision of the "wall built true to plumb." After years in Joseph's workshop, Jesus came to know that building a Church, building the kingdom of heaven, would require constant reference to a solid foundation and the work of the Master builder.

Whenever we set out to build something new in the Kingdom or restore a structure once destroyed, we must hold the plumb-line in our hands and check to see if it squares with the foundation laid by our Lord and by the saints and apostles who followed him. We often turn to Scripture to reference that foundation, and to the work of prayer as provided for in the *Book of Common Prayer*.

Take some time this summer to read through the Catechism of the *Book of Common Prayer* 1979, a section at a time, as a way of reacquainting yourself with the foundation once laid for our faith. Think of this time as an opportunity to put your hands on tools occasionally forgotten but that nevertheless remain of central importance to the building up of the Body of Christ.



SUMMARY OF VESTRY MINUTES

At its regularly scheduled meeting of **April 23**, the Cathedral Vestry:

• received the report of the parish Finance committee recommending the formation of an "Endowment Visioning Committee," the Finance Committee's report noted that quarterly pledge statements were mailed to the parish on April 30;


• as of April 30, contributions to the General Fund for 2012 were 2.7% (or \$25,185) behind budgeted projections. Expenses paid from the General Fund for the same time period in 2012 were +16.1% (\$13,783) behind budgeted expense projections. For the 1st quarter of 2012 the General Fund budget shows a favorable \$13,783 bottom line;

• received the report of the Property Committee noting the coming completion of the Stained Glass window restoration project, roof damage sustained during a recent hail storm, and a progress update on the campus-wide signage project;

• heard the report of the Curate on new Young Adult Ministry initiatives;

• heard the report of the Dean on staff changes, on parish leadership changes (First Friday and Cultural Arts), and on the recently completed *Journey in Faith* course.

EfM is a Christian education and formation program developed by the School of Theology at Sewanee. EfM covers the basics of a theological education in the Old and New Testaments, church history, liturgy, and theology

with emphasis on theological reflection. Students enroll for one year at a time, and complete the course in four years. More information is available on the EfM web site, sewanee.edu/ EfM. 

An Open Letter to the Parents, Grandparents and Seekers at Christ Church Cathedral...

Each fall, we commission a large group of volunteers who will work with children during the upcoming school year. Some of these individuals have been doing this work for many years, and others are brand new. At this service, we hear the prayer, "God of all wisdom and knowledge, give your blessing and guidance to all who teach in your Church, that by word and example they may lead those whom they teach to the knowledge and love of you; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen." Each year when I hear that prayer, I say another thanking God for the children under my care who will lead me to a greater knowledge and love of Jesus Christ.

When I asked catechists for thoughts to share with you, one commented, "I hate to say it, but what I do each Sunday is selfish, I get to be with these wonderful children and learn from them. If more people knew what the experience was like we would be covered up with adults who wanted to do what we do."

I am inviting you to join those of us who work with the children on Sunday morning. Where else would you have the opportunity to openly wonder, as I have this past year with the first graders, "What is your soul (23rd Psalm)? What does it mean to be baptized and, (their question) if you are not baptized, are you still part of the community? Where do you see the Holy Spirit working in the world around you? Where do you see it working in your life? Why did Jesus have to die on the cross (again, this is their question)? Can we ever be lost to God?" The children have these questions and they also know the answers – their understanding comes from God.

This summer and fall we will be offering training classes for those who want to learn more about the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd; one course will take place during the week of August 20-24 and will be part one of a two-part training. The other course will take place on Tuesdays beginning in October. Each course provides lunch and childcare for participants. These courses are open to anyone who wants to attend and we expect participants from throughout the Diocese and community. For more information about these courses, contact me at

In order for the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd to continue as a vibrant part of our community we need new volunteers to attend our training classes. So, choose a class, whether it is for one week in August or on Tuesdays throughout the year. Many of us who do this work were encouraged by friends or interests to take the training. For some of us, it was that sense of responsibility to participate in the educational programs of the church – wasn't everyone supposed to be a Sunday school teacher for at least a year? What we have found is that the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd has nurtured and shaped our own faith – it has become who we are. So as you consider your call to become engaged in this work – be prepared, it will change you, the way you parent your children and live your life.

As you look forward to the summer, I encourage you to pray and read the Bible with your children. Come to church each Sunday and encourage your children to follow the service in the Prayer Book and the Hymnal. Bring them to Cathedral Camp where we will look at the gifts God has given to us and our responsibility to care for creation. Listen to your children, give them times of silence and wonder, let them enjoy the gifts of God that surround all of us. This is an important time in the life of a family, the time to create special memories. And remember, you do not need to have all the answers; the questions and the wondering are what is important.

I hope that you will respond to the call to join in the ministry of working with children in the parish. They are the future and it is a blessing to be with them.

I would like to close with the following from *The Book of Common Prayer:* "O God, in the course of this busy life, give us times of refreshment and peace; and grant that we may so use our leisure to rebuild our bodies and renew our minds, that our spirits may be opened to the goodness of your creation, through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen." (p. 825)

"Perween," a Kurdish woman in her forties, is widowed, very poor, struggles with language barriers, and has no transportation. She suffers greatly from rheumatoid arthritis and chronic depression, requiring expensive medication. Siloam was able to arrange for a rheumatologist to see Perween at the clinic, and her medicine is now donated through the Prescription Drug Assistance Program and delivered to Siloam. Volunteer techs use on-site x-ray equipment to offset her expensive fees, and our behavioral health consultant counsels and encourages Perween each time she visits. A local church coordinates rides for all of her Siloam appointments. And, through a YMCA connection, she now goes to the gym regularly to meet with a personal guide who assists her with exercise goals to help improve her mobility.
