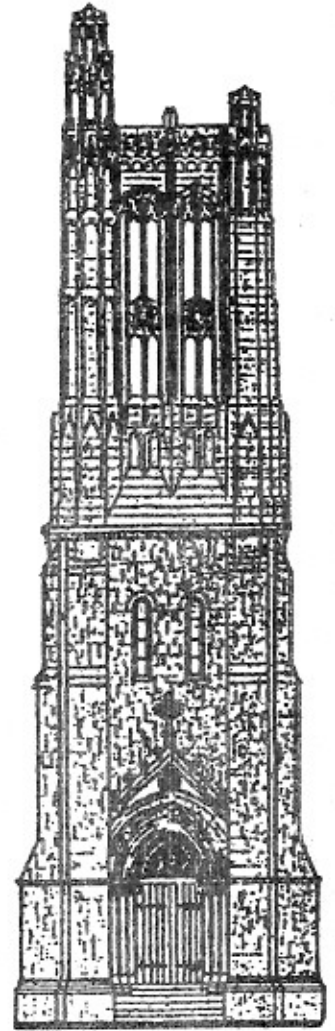

I bind unto myself today the virtues of the starlit heaven
the glorious sun's life giving ray, the whiteness of the moon at even,
the flashing of the lightning free, the whirling wind's tempestuous shocks,
the stable earth, the deep salt sea, around the old eternal rocks.

I bind unto myself today the power of God to hold and lead,
his eye to watch, his might to stay, his ear to hearken, to my need;
the wisdom of my God to teach, his hand to guide, his shield to ward;
the word of God to give me speech, his heavenly host to be my guard.

Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me,
Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me,
Christ to comfort and restore me,

Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet,

The congregation is seated.

The Institution

The Wardens, standing before the Bishop with the Dean, say

Bishop Herlong, we have come together today to welcome Kenneth Swanson, who has been chosen to serve as Dean and Rector of Christ Church Cathedral.

We believe that he is well qualified, and that he has been prayerfully and lawfully selected.

The Letter of Institution is read.

The Bishop then says

Kenneth, do you, in the presence of this congregation, commit yourself to this new trust and responsibility?

The Dean responds I do.

The congregation stands.

The Bishop then addresses the congregation

Will you who witness this new beginning support and uphold Kenneth in this ministry?

People We will.

The Bishop escorts the Dean to the seat appointed, and says

Kenneth, in the name of the Wardens and Vestry of this Cathedral Church, and on behalf of the people of this Diocese, take this seat, that you may show forth the glory of God by your ministry and example, and diligently promote the building of the body of Christ in this Cathedral and this Diocese; and that you may effectively perform the same, may God make the grace of the Holy Spirit abound in you. *Amen.*

The Bishop says

Let us offer our prayers to God for all his people, for this congregation, and for Kenneth their Dean and Rector.

The Litany

For Edmond, our Presiding Bishop; Frank, our Presiding Bishop-elect; Bertram, our Bishop, and for all bishops, priests, and deacons, that they may be filled with your love, may hunger for truth, and may thirst after righteousness, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For Kenneth, chosen Dean and Rector of Christ Church Cathedral, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

That he may faithfully fulfill the duties of this ministry, build up your Church, and glorify your Name, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

That by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit he may be sustained and encouraged to persevere to the end, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For his family, that they may be adorned with all Christian virtues, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For all who fear God and believe in you, Lord Christ, that our divisions may cease and that all may be one as you and the Father are one, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For the mission of the Church, that in faithful witness it may preach the Gospel to the ends of the earth, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For those who do not yet believe, and for those who have lost their faith, that they may receive the light of the Gospel, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For the peace of the world, that a spirit of respect and forbearance may grow among nations and peoples, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For those in positions of public trust, that they may serve justice and promote the dignity and freedom of every person, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For a blessing upon all human labor, and for the right use of the riches of creation, that the world may be freed from poverty, famine, and disaster, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For the poor, the persecuted, the sick, and all who suffer; for refugees, prisoners, and all who are in danger; that they may be relieved and protected, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For ourselves; for the forgiveness of our sins, and for the grace of the Holy Spirit to amend our lives, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For all who have died in the communion of your Church, and those whose faith is known to you alone, that, with all the saints, they may have rest in that place where there is no pain or grief, but life eternal, we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Rejoicing in the fellowship of the ever-blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints, let us commend ourselves, and one another

The Induction

Representatives of the congregation and of the clergy of the Diocese stand before the Bishop with the Dean.

Representatives of the Vestry present a Bible, saying

Kenneth, accept this Bible, and be among us as one who proclaims the Word.
People Amen.

The Bishop presents a vessel of water, saying

Kenneth, take this water, and help me baptize in obedience to our Lord.
People Amen.

The Associate Clergy present a stole, saying

Kenneth, receive this stole, and be among us as a pastor and priest.
People Amen.

The Organist-Choirmaster and the Assistant Director of Cathedral Choristers present a Hymnal, saying

Kenneth, receive this Hymnal that we may sing and make music to the glory of God.
People Amen.

Representatives of the Search Committee present a Book of Common Prayer, saying

Kenneth, receive this book, and be among us as a man of prayer.
People Amen.

Representatives of the Stephen Ministry present oil, saying

Kenneth, use this oil, and be among us as a healer and reconciler.
People Amen.

Representatives from Grace Episcopal Church, Millbrook, New York, present a painting, saying

Kenneth, receive this painting in thanksgiving for your ten-year ministry with us, and may God continue to bless you in the days ahead.

People Amen.

The Wardens present the keys of the church, saying

Kenneth, receive these keys, and let the doors of this place be open to all people.

People Amen.

The Canon to the Ordinary and the Canon for Ministry of the Diocese present the Constitution and Canons of this Church, saying

Kenneth, obey these Canons, and be among us to share in the councils of this Diocese.

People Amen.

Representatives of the Liturgy Committee present bread and wine, saying

Kenneth, take this bread and wine, and be among us to break the Bread and bless the Cup.

People Amen.

Representatives of Christian Education present a statue of the Good Shepherd, saying

Kenneth, receive this symbol of Jesus the Good Shepherd, and be to us a pastor and teacher.

People Amen.

Representatives of the Youth present a Celtic cross, saying

Kenneth, receive this cross, and be to us a guide and friend on our journey to adulthood.

People Amen.

Representatives of the Cathedral staff present a Daily Office Book, saying

Kenneth, receive this book, and help us to model our lives upon the Holy Scriptures.

People Amen.

The Bishop then says

Kenneth, let all these be signs of the ministry which is mine and yours in this place.

People Amen.

The Dean kneels in the midst of the church, and says

O Lord my God, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; yet you have called your servant to stand in your house, and to serve at your altar. To you and to your service I devote myself, body, soul, and spirit. Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works; enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit; and may all the desires of my heart and will center in what you would have me do. Make me an instrument of your salvation for the people entrusted to my care, and grant that I may faithfully administer your holy Sacraments, and by my life and teaching set forth your true and living Word. Be always with me in carrying out the duties of my ministry. In prayer, quicken my devotion; in praises, heighten my love and gratitude; in preaching, give me readiness of thought and expression; and grant that, by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word, all the world may be drawn into your blessed kingdom. All this I ask for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

The Bishop then presents the Dean to the congregation, saying

Greet your Dean and Rector.

The family of the Dean is presented at this time.

The Congregation expresses its approval. Applause is appropriate.

The Bishop greets the Dean.

The Dean then says to the people

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

The Dean then greets other members of the clergy, family members, and the congregation.

The People greet one another.

By your Spirit, fashion our lives according to the example of your Son, and grant that we may show the power of your love to all among whom we live; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
