COLLECT OF THE DAY

Blessed Lord, who hast caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: Grant that we may in such wise hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them; that, by patience and comfort of thy holy Word, we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which thou hast given us in our Savior Jesus Christ; who liveth and reigneth with thee and the holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

OLD TESTAMENT READING – Daniel 12:1-3

At that time Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.

PSALM 16

1. Protect me, O God, for I take refuge in you; *
I have said to the LORD, “You are my Lord,
my good above all other.”
2. All my delight is upon the godly that are in the land, *
upon those who are noble among the people.
3. But those who run after other gods *
shall have their troubles multiplied.
4. Their libations of blood I will not offer, *
nor take the names of their gods upon my lips.
5. O LORD, you are my portion and my cup; *
it is you who uphold my lot.
6. My boundaries enclose a pleasant land; *
indeed, I have a goodly heritage.

nor let you holy one see the Pit.
11. Your will show me the path of life; *
in your presence there is fullness of joy,
and in your right hand are pleasures for evermore.

NEW TESTAMENT READING – Hebrews 10:11-25

And every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, ‘he sat down at the right hand of God’, and since then has been waiting ‘until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.’ For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us, for after saying, ‘this is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds’, he also adds, ‘I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more.’ Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin. Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

THE GOSPEL LESSON – Mark 13:1-8

As he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, ‘Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!’ Then Jesus asked him, ‘Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down.’ When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, ‘Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?’ Then Jesus began to say to them, ‘Beware that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name and say, “I am he!” And they will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs.

The election of a new class of Christ Church Cathedral Vestry members will take place in January 2013. The Vestry Nominating Committee is presently seeking suggestions of Cathedral parishioners who the Vestry. Suggested individuals must be at least 18 years old and confirmed members of Christ Church Cathedral. Members of the year’s retiring class of the Vestry, including John Bridges, Steve Lasley, Susie Ries, Sandy Sanders, and Marie Stringer Yeagle, are ineligible, as are members of the previous class, including Catherine Clark, Dave Goetz, Mary Herbert Kelly, Scott Smith, and John Whitaker.

Please give prayerful thought to suggesting fellow parishioners who might well serve the Cathedral as Vestry members and forward the names to Dede Clements at dedeclements@comcast.net, or 615.715.6540. The deadline for suggesting individuals is Sunday, December 2. The Vestry Nominating Committee will then finalize a slate of 10 nominees, according to the approved Vestry Election Procedures, “two nominees for each vacancy on the Vestry, bearing in mind the age and gender distribution of the parish.”

In early January 2013, the slate of nominees will be presented to the parish, with photographs and biographical information. On Sunday, January 27, the nominees will be introduced at 9:45 a.m. in the Nave, at which time nominations from the floor will also be accepted. The opening of the polls in the Parish Hall will follow. The business portion of the Annual Parish Meeting will take place the following Sunday, February 3. There will be one Liturgy at 9:30 a.m. that day followed by the business portion of the Annual Parish Meeting in the Nave at 10:45 a.m. The opening of election polls will resume in the Parish Hall after the meeting.

Members of the Vestry Nominating Committee include Walker Matthews, appointed by the Senior Warden; Dede Clements and Sandra Merritt, appointed by the Dean; and John Bridges and Sandy Sanders, selected by lot from the retiring Vestry class.
