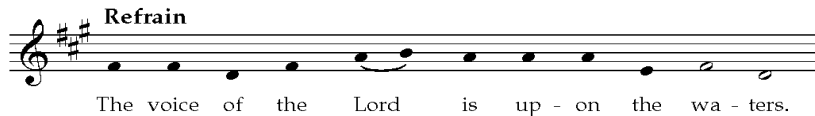
Father in heaven, who at the baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan proclaimed him your beloved Son and anointed him with the Holy Spirit: Grant that all who are baptized into his Name may keep the covenant they have made, and boldly confess him as Lord and Savior; who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting. *Amen.*

OLD TESTAMENT READING – Isaiah 43:1-7

But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. 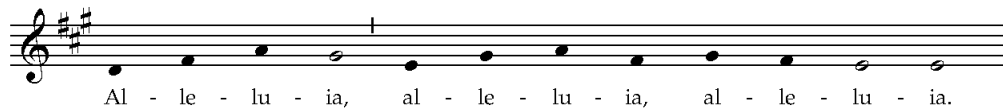

THE GOSPEL LESSON – Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, ‘I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. Dr. Jeremy Begbie will show how music has unique powers to reach into the depths and heights of the Gospel. Friday evening will feature an event with Dean Timothy Kimbrough and Jeremy Begbie and piano. Saturday will feature two lectures (including piano performance and recorded music) entitled "Re-Shaping Lament: Music and the Psalms of Sorrow" and "Joy in the Morning: The Music of Resurrection."

Dr. Begbie is the inaugural holder of the Thomas A. Langford Research Professorship in Theology at Duke University Divinity School. He is also a Senior Member at Wolfson College, Cambridge and Affiliated Lecturer in the Faculty of Music at the University of Cambridge.
