On Wednesday, February 13, the Metropolitan Homelessness Commission will host the fifth annual Project Homeless Connect at the Tennessee State Fairgrounds. About 300 volunteers are needed. Volunteer sign up is held through Hands On Nashville, at hon.org. Volunteers are needed to serve in a wide range of capacities during this event. There are three shifts available for volunteering: 7:30 a.m.-4 p.m., 7:30 a.m.-12 p.m., and 11:30 a.m.-4 p.m. You must be 18 or older to volunteer during Project Homeless Connect. Volunteer training sessions will be held on Tuesday, February 12, at noon or 5:30 p.m. Directions for parking (which is free) and entrance will be emailed to all volunteers prior to the training and the event.
