Associate Professor in Organ and Sacred Music Indiana University, Bloomington

Bruce Newsick is Associate Professor of Music in Organ and Sacred Music at the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University. Prior to joining this faculty in the summer of 2011, he was the Director of Music at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City, where he directed the Cathedral Choir of Girls, Boys and Adults and had oversight of the musical life of that historic Cathedral.

Active in the field of church music, Mr. Neswick holds the Fellowship degree from the Royal School of Church Music, for whom he has conducted several courses for boy and girl choristers.

As a recitalist, Mr. Neswick has performed extensively throughout the United States and Europe and has been a featured performer at national and regional conventions of the American Guild of Organists. In 1994, he played the opening convocation for the national AGO convention held in Dallas, Texas, and he was a featured artist at the national AGO conventions in Seattle (in 2000) and Washington, DC (in 2010).
