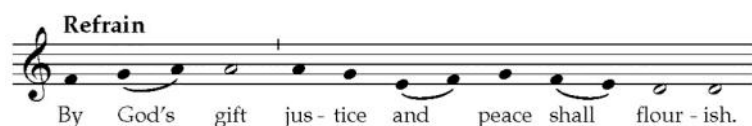

THE NEW TESTAMENT LESSON – Romans 15:4-13

Whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. 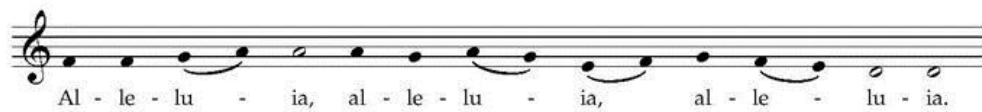

THE GOSPEL LESSON – Matthew 3:1-12

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.'" Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit worthy of repentance. Do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. "I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Called to Gratitude

To date, 453 households have pledged a little over \$1.64 million to the 2014 Every Member Canvass. Many thanks to all who have pledged! Budget planning is fast approaching, and pledges will determine the Christ Church Cathedral budget for 2014. Although 44 percent of the amount pledged in the 2014 Canvass represents new or increased pledges, we remain about \$165,000 short of last year's total. The Dean and Vestry are not prepared to continue the practice of planned deficit budgets and may need to curtail budget expenditures in 2014. If you have not yet pledged, please consider what you might return of your first fruits to ensure the parish's financial health and provide for the building up of the Kingdom at Christ Church.

Special 2013 Year-end Contributions

As you prepare your 2013 year-end contributions to favorite charities and ministries, please remember Christ Church Cathedral. Consider a one-time special gift over and above your regular giving to the Cathedral's General Fund (perhaps as a gift honoring a loved one). The Dean and Vestry need your assistance to reduce budget deficits of the last several years. A return to a balanced budget through your support and generosity will further the mission and ministry of Christ Church. It will strengthen the Cathedral's position as an urban center for Christian worship, the deepening of Nashville's faith, and the relief of the poor.



A Message From the Treasurer to Parishioners Aged 70 1/2 Who Own An IRA

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 introduced a provision enabling retirees age 70 1/2 and older to take tax-free withdrawals from their IRA provided the money is transferred directly to a qualified charitable organization of their choice. Generally, when you take a distribution from your IRA, it is treated as taxable income. Under this temporary provision, until December 31, 2013, retirees may donate up to \$100,000 tax-free if the distribution is made directly to a charity such as Christ Church Cathedral. Disbursements to charity can also satisfy any required minimum distributions for the year. This provision has allowed some Christ Church parishioners to give generously with substantial tax savings. In a new Advent tradition that began last year, volunteers will deliver Jesse trees to ill or infirm members of the Cathedral. This is a wonderful way to share the love of Christ with members of our parish family who have been unable to come to the Cathedral to worship. Decorations for the trees were made by children at the Advent Event. Please consider gathering your family or a group of friends

A Jesse tree is a small evergreen that represents Jesus's family tree, which rose from Jesse of Bethlehem, the father of King David. The Jesse tree derives its name from Isaiah 11:1: *A shoot will spring forth from the stump of Jesse, and a branch out of his roots.* The branch is a biblical sign of newness, and is therefore an appropriate symbol of Christ, who is the revelation of the grace and faithfulness of God.

Jesse trees are decorated with ornaments that symbolize the people, prophecies, and events leading up to the birth of Jesus, thereby connecting the Advent season with the faithfulness of God across history. This year the ornaments will be stars symbolizing God's promise to Abraham, Joseph's coat of many colors, a lily symbolizing Mary, and a sheep symbolizing David.
