Frederick Teardo



Frederick Teardo is Director of Music and Organist at the Cathedral Church of the Advent in Birmingham, Alabama. Prior to his appointment in 2012, he held a six-year tenure at St. Thomas Church Fifth Ave. in New York City, where he served for most of that time as Associate Organist, preceded by his initial post as Assistant Organist. He is also Adjunct Instructor of Organ at the University of Montevallo.

Dr. Teardo received the Doctor of Musical Arts degree, as well as the Master of Musical Arts and Master of Music degrees, from the Yale School of Music and Institute of Sacred Music. At Yale, he studied organ with Thomas Murray and harpsichord with Richard Rephann. During his time at Yale, he held the post of Yale University Chapel Organist and later served as Assistant Organist at Trinity Episcopal Church on the Green in New Haven, CT.

An avid performer, Dr. Teardo has won first prize in numerous competitions and has performed across North America, including such venues as the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, Saint Bartholomew's Church, Saint Patrick's Cathedral and the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City, Washington National Cathedral, Grace Cathedral in San Francisco, Methuen Memorial Music Hall, Trinity Church Copley Square in Boston, Princeton University Chapel, and the Cathedral Church of the Redeemer in Calgary, Alberta. Dr. Teardo's solo recording is available from JAV Recordings, and features works of Bach, Boyvin and De Grigny on the historic 1741 J.A. Silbermann organ of Saint Thomas Church in Strasbourg, France. He has also been a featured performer at Regional and National Conventions of the American Guild of Organists and Organ Historical Society, on American Public Media's *Pipedreams*, on BBC Radio 3 and on four CD recordings with the Saint Thomas Choir.

Some of Nashville's most accomplished musicians interpret works by the master in this celebration of the music of Johann Sebastian Bach. The evening will feature some 38 pieces performed by musicians from the Nashville Symphony, Belmont University, Blair School of Music, Middle Tennessee State University, and David Lipscomb University, as well as studio musicians, church musicians, and talented students.

Among the complete major works to be performed are Cantata 106, Solo Cello Suites no. 1 and 2, Toccata in F for organ, Sonata in B minor for flute and harpsichord, and the Violin Concerto in D. Some works will be performed on authentic Baroque instruments, including viola da gamba, oboe d'amore, baroque cello, harpsichord, and recorder, others on instruments Bach wrote for, including organ, piano, strings, winds, and brass.

One of the hallmarks of BACHanalia, however, is the inclusion of non-traditional arrangements of Bach's music, and this year jazz, saxophone, and harp quartets, as well as several clarinetists, will interpret works by the master in unexpected and innovative ways.
