and the offerings of well-being of your fatted animals

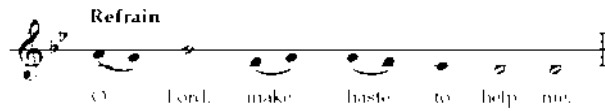
I will not look upon.

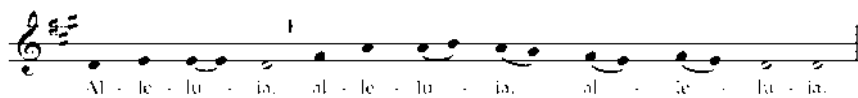
