THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON – Isaiah 61:10 – 62:3

I will greatly rejoice in the LORD,

my whole being shall exult in my God;

for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation,

and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.

THE NEW TESTAMENT LESSON - Galatians 3:23-25; 4:4-7

Now before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian.

But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.

THE GOSPEL LESSON - John 1:1-18

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.") From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

YEAR END GIVING

At the end of the year questions are posed by parishioners and friends of the Cathedral in greater frequency about the timing and nature of gifts that may be made to the Cathedral. Below please find a few representative questions and answers that may be helpful to you as you consider your year-end giving. Every tithe and gift made to Christ Church Cathedral goes to support our primary mission to "proclaim the Good News of God in Christ, seeking and serving Christ in all persons" at the corner of 9th Ave. and Broadway. Please give generously that all may know the power and joy of this Good News.

1) How may I best deliver my tithe/offering/gift to Christ Church Cathedral? Cash, Check, Credit Card, PayPal, a gift of stock, an IRA Charitable rollover, or a gift in kind.

Cash—If you give by cash, please place it in the alms basin the next time you are at worship.

Check—If you give by check, you may place your check in the alms basins when you worship. A check may also be hand delivered or mailed by US Post during the week to the Cathedral to Larry Smith's (bookkeeper) attention.

Credit Card—To give by credit card, please contact the parish bookkeeper to set up this gift.

PayPal—If you wish to give by PayPal, go to the Cathedral's website (christcathedral.org), click on the "Support the Cathedral" link, and follow the instructions there.

Gift of stock—If you wish to give a gift of stock to the Cathedral, please call 615.255.7729 and ask for Larry Smith, the Cathedral bookkeeper, and notify him of the impending gift. You may also email Larry at lsmith@christcathedral.org. It's important that he know a gift is coming. The stock brokerage does not consistently forward the individual's name to be associated with the gift.

An IRA Charitable Rollover—If you are 70 1/2 or older you may qualify to make a charitable contribution directly from your IRA to Christ Church Cathedral. A few of the requirements follow below:

- donors must have reached age 70 1/2 and older
- a donor's IRA rollover qualified for the required minimum distribution (RMD)
- distribution can only be made from traditional IRAs or Roth IRAs
- distributions must be made directly from the IRA trustee payable to the public charity

If you are interested in exploring an IRA gift, please check with your tax advisor.

A gift in kind—Please contact the Wardens (Scott Smith or Pete Stringer), the Treasurer (Ed Burgess), or the Dean to explore this possibility. Gifts of real property are accepted with approval of the Vestry on recommendation of the Vestry officers.

2) What is the latest date that I may still get IRS credit for a 2014 contribution?

December 31, 2014. Your contribution must be hand delivered to the church office or postmarked and placed in the mail by the end of the day. If you make your contribution online at the Christ Church website through the PayPal link, the time/date stamp must show the contribution as having been completed before midnight 12/31/14.

3) I haven't made a pledge for 2015 yet. May I still make a pledge? Yes, you may. The easiest way to do so is at the Cathedral website. At the Cathedral's homepage click on "Make a pledge" and follow the instructions there.

4) I never completed payment on my 2013 pledge. May I still do so before the end of 2014?

Yes, you may. Any contribution you make towards the fulfillment of your 2013 pledge will be credited to you on your final 2014 contribution statement mailed to your home shortly after the first of the year.
