THE NEW TESTAMENT LESSON - Acts 19:1-7

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They answered, "Into John's baptism." Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied—altogether there were about twelve of them.

THE GOSPEL LESSON - Mark 1:4-11

John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

The Reverend Père Noé Bernier, the Diocese of Haiti



Père Noé is currently the priest-incharge of St. André Episcopal School in Hinche, Haiti. He is a graduate of the University of the West Indies (B.Th.) and Codrington College in Barbados (Dipl. in Pastoral Studies). Père Noé and his wife, Sheryl, Michel, have five children

including two sets of twins. As an ordained priest in the Diocese of Haiti (1998), he has served three different churches: La Resurrection in Gros Morne, Gonaives, 1998-2003; St. Esprit in Cap Haitien, 2003-2013; and St. André in Hinche, 2013-the present.

The needs of the church in Haiti are immense. The Church could use assistance at every turn from maintaining physical plants to the education of children (meals, uniforms, teacher salaries) to assistance with agriculture, to medical missions. Père Noé has facilitated partnerships with other Episcopal churches in the U.S. for several of the churches he has served along the way: St. Martin-in-the-Fields, Severna Park, Maryland; St. Andrew's, New Castle, Maine; Church of the Holy Family, Chapel Hill, NC; and St. Andre's, Carmel Valley, California.

ON ISLAM: A BOOK STUDY

Beginning in January, the Cathedral will offer a Sunday school class introducing parishioners to the religion and culture of Islam. Topics will include the life of Muhammad, the Qur'an and hadith, Islamic jurisprudence and theology, Shi'ism, Sufism, and recent liberal, modernist, and revivalist movements in the Islamic world. Daniel Schafer, professor of history at Belmont University, will serve as instructor for the course. Participants are asked to purchase *An Introduction to Islam* by David Waines (second edition, Cambridge University Press, 2003), which participants will read as the key text for the course. An introductory class will be held January 18; regular classes begin February 8, and run until early May, meeting during the Sunday school hour in the Chapel. DISCIPLESHIP IN A SICK SOCIETY

FEATURING

DR. ELLEN F. DAVIS

In these lectures, Dr. Davis will look at Matthew's Gospel, with its particular emphasis on the life of discipleship, against the background of the challenges faced by Jewish Christians in the Greco-Roman world. This was a world in some way like our own, characterized by acute social inequities, violence, militarism, and hunger both physical and spiritual. Dr. Davis will highlight how Matthew's prophetic understanding of discipleship reflects his reading of the "Old Testament," and especially the evangelical prophet Isaiah. Further, she will consider how the Beatitudes and the Lord's Prayer may be seen as prophetic disciplines for contemporary Christians.



Ellen F. Davis is the Amos Ragan Kearns Distinguished Professor of Bible and Practical Theology at Duke University Divinity School. The author of nine books and many articles, her research interests focus on how biblical interpretation bears on the life of faith communities and their responses to urgent public issues, particularly the environmental crisis and interfaith relations.
