O God, whose blessed Son did manifest himself to his disciples in the breaking of bread: Open, we pray thee, the eyes of our faith, that we may behold him in all his redeeming work; through the same thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

THE FIRST LESSON – Acts 3:12-19

When Peter saw the astonishment of those who had seen the lame man healed, he addressed the people, "You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you.

"And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out."

THE SECOND LESSON – 1 John 3:1-7

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

THE GOSPEL LESSON – Luke 24:36b-48

Jesus himself stood among the disciples and their companions and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence.

Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you-- that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

Dearly beloved, we are gathered here in the sight of God and before this congregation to admit this His servant into The Order of the Daughters of the King. We commend her to your earnest prayers that she may have grace to fulfill the obligations of the Order and that her labors may be to the glory of God and to the welfare of all. The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Sub-Dean: Let us pray.

O God, our Father and our King, grant to this your servant such a measure of your heavenly grace that she may be mindful always whose child she is and daily increase in your Holy Spirit that by your wisdom and strength she may, with those whom she brings to you, come to your everlasting Kingdom, for the sake of your Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

To the candidate: Do you promise faithfully to obey the two Rules of the Order; the Rule of Prayer and the Rule of Service? To offer at all times your loyal aid to the clergy and to the parish to advance the cause of Christ? To wear habitually the cross of the Order? And to work for its purposes, as God may give you the opportunity?

Candidate: I do, with God's help.

Sub-Dean: Will you support this woman in her ministry of prayer and service?

Congregation: We will.

Sub-Dean: Bless, O Lord, this cross and grant to your servant now to be admitted to this Order such abundance of your grace that she may wear this sacred symbol in the spirit of humility and with devotion to the service of the King of kings. Amen.

Sub-Dean: I receive and admit you into membership of the Order in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Accept and wear faithfully this mark of your membership, remembering the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, "Take up your cross and follow me."

All Daughters of the King: O eternal Father, you have sent us your Son to teach us things pertaining to your heavenly Kingdom. Give your blessing to our Order wherever it may be throughout the world. Grant that we, your Daughters, ever may discern your truth and bear the cross through the battle of our earthly life. Give us strength to overcome temptation and the grace to work to spread your Kingdom and to gather your scattered sheep within your fold. Pour out upon us the sevenfold gift of the Holy Spirit that we may always remember it is your work we are called to do; that all we think, do or say may be pleasing in your sight. We ask it all For His Sake, our King and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

APRIL ECONOMIC JUSTICE CHALLENGE: RIDE THE BUS

The Economic Justice committee invites all Christ Church members to join us in the practice of taking on an "economic justice challenge of the month".



As Christians, our concern for good public transit comes not only from the biblical injunction to "seek the welfare of the city," (Jeremiah 29:7) but also from the call to care for "the least of these who are members of [God's] family" (Matthew 25:40). For many of the poorest members of our community, as well as for the disabled and the elderly, public transit is not just a sustainable means of moving the population of our growing city; it is the only means of getting to work, school or worship. Those who rely on public transit see a different Nashville than the one seen from the car. In April, let's ride the bus, and see our community through a different lens. For those who do not regularly ride the bus, try to take at least one bus trip this month. For those who do ride the bus, take a trip once on a bus you do not normally ride.

The Economic Justice Committee will be organizing a few rides to church and a bus brunch, so please join us for the following:

Sunday, April 26: The Bus Brunch! After the 11 a.m. Liturgy, we will ride the bus to Amerigo on West End for brunch, and return by bus to the Cathedral afterwards. Meet us at the bus bench in front of the Cathedral at 12:30 p.m.



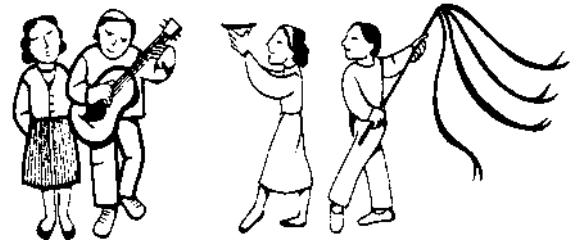
