THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON - Isaiah 6:1-8



So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh-for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. THE GOSPEL LESSON – John 3:1-17

There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? 

EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY (EfM)



EfM is a Christian education and formation program developed by the School of Theology at Sewanee, which takes place at Episcopal churches across the country and online. EfM covers the basics of a theological education in the Old and New Testaments, church history, liturgy, and theology with emphasis on theological reflection. Students enroll for one year at a time,

and complete the course in four years. More information is available on the EfM website, **efm.sewanee.edu**. The cost is \$350/year. Partial scholarships may be available. Christ Church groups meet on Tuesday evenings or Wednesday mornings during the academic year and each has room for a limited number of new students. Enrollment for **new** and **returning** students is underway now on a first-come first-served basis. **The registration deadline is August 3**. 

ST. MATTHEW WINDOW

Given to the Glory of God and in Memory of A. H. Robinson. The window was given by Delia Baxter Robinson in memory of her husband. A. H. Robinson served 27 years as a Vestryman including seven years as Senior Warden. He was on the Vestry at Old Christ Church from 1876 through 1893. He served again at "new" Christ Church on 9th and Broadway from 1909 until his death in 1919.

St. Matthew is one of the four Gospel Windows, designed in 1928, by the Geissler & Company of New York. The Gospel windows are located above the Columbarium.


