THE NEW TESTAMENT LESSON – Ephesians 5:15-20

THE GOSPEL LESSON – John 6:51-58

Jesus said, “I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.”

The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, “How can this man give us his flesh to eat?” So Jesus said to them, “Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever.”

THE ORDER OF THE DAUGHTERS OF THE KING ST. CATHERINE'S CHAPTER INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS

Today the Daughters of the King installs officers of the Chapter for 2015-2018. The Reverend Gene B. Manning, Chaplain.

“The Order of the Daughters of the King is an Order for women who are communicants of the Episcopal Church, churches in communion with it, or churches in the Historic Episcopate. The Order was founded in 1885 by Margaret J. Franklin at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in New York City. Our Anglican tradition includes Episcopal oversight, Holy Scripture containing all things necessary for salvation, recognition of the gift of Holy Spirit in Baptism, the real presence of our Lord in the Holy Eucharist and worship according to *The Book of Common Prayer*. Members undertake a Rule of Life, incorporating the Rule of Prayer and the Rule of Service. By reaffirmation of the promises made at Baptism and Confirmation, a Daughter pledges herself to a life-long program of prayer, service and evangelism, dedicated to the spread of Christ's Kingdom and the strengthening of the spiritual life of her parish.”

BEQUEST BY WILLIE D. BUNTIN

GIFT OF CIBORIUM BY HER FAMILY
GIVEN TO THE GLORY OF GOD AND TO CHRIST CHURCH

By her will, Willie D. Buntin left \$67,163.46 to Christ Church in 2002. Willie D. Johnson and Horatio Berry Buntin were married in Christ Church Chapel in 1947.

A silver ciborium was presented to the Glory of God and in memory of Horatio Berry and Willie D. Buntin by her sister Lucile Johnson Nelson, her niece Mary Nelson Wade, and her great nieces DeeDee Johnson Wade and Mary Fall Wade.

The ciborium, dedicated on April 19, 2009, was designed and fabricated by Margaret Fleming of Nashville.

"Hands of Mercy" events are one-time opportunities for members of the Cathedral congregation to serve and benefit a worthy institution supported by the Cathedral. The next Hands of Mercy event will be August 22 at the Nashville Food Project, located on the campus of Woodmont Christian Church at 3605 Hillsboro Pike. Approximately 35 volunteers are needed to work in TNFP's garden and prepare food. Garden volunteers will work from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m., and food prep will take place from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. The food prep team will prepare meals in the kitchen, using recovered, donated, and garden-grown food to cook healthy hot meals. There's a lot of creativity involved in planning meals based on what comes in from the food donation partners—and a lot of work for the volunteers who chop, slice, clean, assemble, blanch, compost, and cook. Children age 10 and up are welcome to participate, so this will be a wonderful opportunity for families to work together to help the vulnerable populations served by the Nashville Food Project. UPCOMING CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD TRAINING

Christ Church Cathedral will be offering a Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level I training course for adults. Level I of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd covers the presentations that are offered to 3-6 year-olds. The course includes information on the characteristics of the 3-6 year old child and lessons that have been used over the past 50 years to encourage the faith life of young children through prayer, liturgy, and the Bible. A typical training lasts for 90 hours and Christ Church will offer a new format for this class. The course will meet as follows:

Saturday, September 12, 9 a.m.–2 p.m.;
Saturday, January 30, 9 a.m.–2 p.m.; and
Wednesdays, dinner at 5:30 p.m. followed by class
from 6 to 8 p.m. These classes will be held beginning
September 16 and continue to November 11; they will
break until January 13 and continue to April 13 (with
breaks for Ash Wednesday and Holy Week).

Childcare and meals will be provided for all classes. There is a nominal charge for the meal and a \$35 registration fee for Christ Church Cathedral parishioners. Completion of this course will prepare you to lead a Level I class for children or you may want to take this class for your own spiritual growth. Adult participants of all ages are welcome.
