Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

Then he told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

"Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."

NEW ALTAR TABLE IN THE CHANCEL

Given to the Glory of God and in Memory of Rebecca Allen Porter and Matilda Allison Porter by their niece Gloria Graves and her husband David.

Rebecca, born February 24, 1872 and died May 11, 1962, and Matilda, born August 5, 1873 and died June 28, 1961, were daughters of Rebecca Allison and Alexander James Porter. Their home, at the corner of Spruce (8th Avenue South) and Demonbreun, was within walking distance of Christ Church. In 1990-1992, the Chancel was enlarged to provide space for a free standing altar. From architectural pieces of the original 1894 Chancel choir stalls, the new altar was created. The Rt. Reverend Bertram Herlong dedicated the new altar in 1995.
