

THE GOSPEL LESSON - Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah,





NEW ALTAR RAIL

Given to the Glory of God and in Memory of Anne Nichols Caldwell

A new altar rail, placed at the front of the newly designed chancel space, was given by Wentworth Caldwell and family in memory of his mother, Anne Nichols Caldwell. She was born in El Paso, Colorado, and married James E. Caldwell, Jr. in El Paso in 1899. Mrs. Caldwell died in Nashville on September 28, 1963.

The iron design was inspired by the altar rail at the Speyer Cathedral in Germany. Wood from the original 1894 altar rail was used in fabrication of the new altar rail by Herndon & Merry Ornamental Metalwork of Nashville in 1992.
