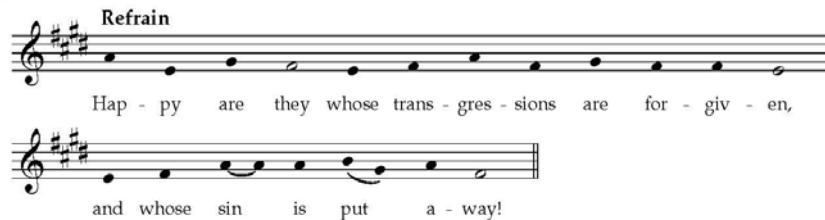
THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON – Isaiah 1:10-18

Hear the word of the LORD,
