HOW CAN WE KEEP UP WITH OUR CHILDREN'S FAITH FORMATION?

How are the family homework and chore routines going? Is there a night you do spelling words at dinner? Are you keeping up with your children's knowledge of the structure of our planet, of math facts or the periodical chart? When our children go to school, we have at least a general sense of what they are learning and know where to go to get more information as needed. There is a continuity, even if you went to school in Kansas and your spouse went to school in Virginia. In large cities and small communities alike, we all expect to learn the rudiments of reading, writing and arithmetic, plus whatever else is deemed important at the time.

Is the same true for what your children are learning about Jesus? About the Kingdom of God as it is seen here on earth and as we look for its coming in the fullness of time? We give one out of seven days to learning about God's plan for us, about the gift He has given us in the resurrection, and we may not know as much as we would like. How can we talk with our children if we don't have all the tools necessary? Google won't tell us very much. Fear not! There are many resources and some of them are right here. When attending Liturgies, there is a lot to see and understand more fully —why do the colors change, do we have a decorator who likes change? Some people kneel, others stand, the cross goes by, and some heads go down. If you have given your children the gift of going to class, they may know the answer. Ask them. The sermons give us a glimpse into the reading—what stood out in the preacher's heart and mind as they read and prayed over the lessons for the day? As far as routines, start simple—prayers over dinner, even if it is in the car on the way to soccer practice or the play rehearsal. A prayer that connects Christians around the world, from all traditions and languages, is the Lord's Prayer. Say it in the car on the way to or from school or at night as you put children to bed. The Lord will surely bless you as you search Him out.


