## NOVEMBER IS GLOBAL ABUNDANCE MONTH

November is Global Abundance Month, a month of prayer and action for abundant food, health, and prosperity for all the peoples of the world. This work is advanced by Global Action Platform and the Global Action Summit (November 14-15), a gathering of world leaders in Nashville each November who work to implement the Sustainable Development Goals facilitated by the United Nations, especially SDGs 1-3—eliminate poverty, eliminate hunger, and provide a healthy life to everyone.



As part of Global Abundance Month, Christ Church Cathedral will host the Reverend Dr. M. Douglas Meeks, Cal Turner Chancellor Professor of Theology, Emeritus, at Vanderbilt University. He is the author or editor of seventeen books including *Origins of the Theology of Hope and God the Economist: The Doctrine of God and Political Economy*. Dr. Meeks is completing a book that is an ecclesiological study of the church in the global economy. He is ordained in the United Methodist Church.

Dr. Meeks will be the featured speaker at the Dean's Forum at 9:45 a.m. and our guest preacher at the 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. Liturgies on Sunday, November 13. Dr. Meeks will also address the spiritual meaning of work and the implications of a “post-employment” society at the Global Action Summit on November 14-15.

Parishioners are encouraged to pay special attention to global food, health, and economic issues during November in their prayers, work, and service activities.

## 2017 SUGGESTIONS FOR VESTRY NOMINATIONS

The election of the Christ Church Cathedral Vestry class of 2020 will take place in January at the Annual Meeting. The Vestry Nominating Committee is presently seeking suggestions of Cathedral parishioners who might serve well on the Vestry. Suggested individuals must be at least 18 years old at the time the election takes place and must be confirmed members of Christ Church Cathedral. Members of the retiring class of the Vestry, including Ellen Wright, Monica Urness, Jon Stanley, Donald McKenzie, and Don Dawson, are ineligible, as are members of the previous class, including Chris Hansen, Scott Hoffman, Anna Grimes Noser, Marian Ott, and Pete Stringer.

Please give prayerful thought to suggesting fellow parishioners who might serve the Cathedral well as Vestry members and forward the names to Rachel Barden at [rbarden0@gmail.com](mailto:rbarden0@gmail.com) or Don Dawson at [don.dawson47@gmail.com](mailto:don.dawson47@gmail.com). The deadline for suggesting individuals is Sunday, December 4. The Vestry Nominating Committee will then finalize a slate of 10 nominees, according to the approved Vestry Election Procedures, "two nominees for each vacancy on the Vestry, bearing in mind the age and gender distribution of the parish."

In early January 2017, the slate of nominees, including photographs and biographical information, will be presented to the parish. On Sunday, January 22, the nominees will be introduced at 9:45 a.m. in the Nave, at which time nominations from the floor will also be accepted. The opening of the polls in the Parish Hall will follow.

The business portion of the Annual Parish Meeting will take place the following Sunday, January 29, at 10:45 in the Nave, followed by open election polls in the Parish Hall. Members of the Vestry Nominating Committee, formed according to the Cathedral's Vestry election procedures, include Rachel Barden, appointed by the Senior Warden; Ophelia Paine and Joshua Rich, appointed by the Dean; and Donald McKenzie and Don Dawson, selected by lot from the retiring Vestry class.
