The Reverend Coleman's topic for the meditations will be "These Acts of Grasping Something Greater"\* The tree: a symbol that bookends our chronicle of salvation history. The tree: an image in Christian culture that provides the shade of overarching themes as much as the branches from which hangs low the basest parts of our humanity. The Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil necessitates the hard wood of the Cross.
