THE CATHEDRAL WELCOMES THE RIGHT REVEREND JO BAILEY WELLS AS OUR GUEST PREACHER THIS MORNING

The Right Reverend Jo Bailey Wells serves as this morning's guest preacher (having been the keynote speaker at this weekend's Annual Diocesan Convention). Bishop Wells, a British Anglican bishop, theologian, and academic, was consecrated the Bishop of Dorking on June 29, 2016, at Canterbury Cathedral. (Dean Kimbrough served as a Eucharistic minister during her consecration). Previously, she was a lecturer in Old Testament and Biblical theology at Ridley Hall, Cambridge, and then associate professor of Bible and Ministry at Duke Divinity School, Duke University. From 2013 until she fully took up her bishop's role on September 25 2016, she served as Chaplain to the Archbishop of Canterbury.



EPIPHANY AND JOURNEYS FOR ALL AGES

In Epiphany we are very aware of journeys. There are the magi who come from afar and before them there were the shepherds who came in from the fields. With the arrival of these two groups, all of the world is present, adoring and honoring Christ the Lord. There is also the journey that Jesus eventually to undertakes, three years of working closely with, teaching, and guiding his disciples, working to bring about the Kingdom of God. This work begins with his baptism and carries through to the Cross and Resurrection.

There is no part of our journey in faith that Christ has not already experienced. He understands all of our small and large steps, those forward and those backwards. He is our shepherd, he is leading his flock. The children are with us on their journeys and may we remember to listen to them and believe as they do. Last Sunday I listened as I heard children ponder on the way good, things that are pleasing to God, can come out of the messiness we create. There are also members of the congregation who are participating in Journey in Faith and they are on a clear journey. Each of us is somewhere on our travels, coming to better know and love our Lord Jesus.

Once baptized we are all full members, with the attendant privileges and responsibilities, as every other member. No one is ever a tourist, always a full member. From that point on, our journeys can look very different, but we are all striving with God's grace to bring about the Kingdom he has offered. The moments we see of charity, beauty, love, and grace, the thin places and moments, help us to continue to move forward. Each of the baptismal prayers is a guide leading us to be fuller members of the Body of Christ. Every time we come to the Eucharist we are filled and renewed by and with God's grace. The times we help someone, whatever their need, are all steps towards bringing about that time when all will be well.

Final voting for the new class of Vestry members will also take place that morning, and all confirmed members age 16 and older are eligible to vote. The Strategic Planning Committee will give a special presentation of the Christ Church Cathedral Strategic Plan, the culmination of two years of work that began with the parish visioning sessions in 2015. Come hear the goals and actions planned for the next several years and view the implementation timeline the committee has developed. These are exciting times in Nashville and Christ Church has exciting plans for reimagining our priorities, programs, and infrastructure so that we may live faithfully and fully into God's call to proclaim, seek, and serve.
