ASH WEDNESDAY

MARCH 1, 2017 | 7:00 A.M., 12:15 P.M., AND 6:00 P.M. NAVE

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, when we begin a time of reflection, self-examination, and spiritual redirection. Lent originated in the very earliest days of the Church as preparation for Easter, when the faithful rededicated themselves and when converts were instructed in the faith and were prepared for baptism. Jesus was sent by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness for 40 days to prepare for his ministry. By observing Lent, we join Jesus on his fast in the wilderness as we consider our mortality and dependence on God. During the Liturgy the foreheads of worshipers are marked with an ashen cross. Being marked with a cross symbolizes that the person belongs to God. This is in imitation of the mark with chrism that is put on in baptism, when we are "marked as Christ's own forever." The ashes are traditionally made from palm fronds from the previous year's Palm Sunday observance.

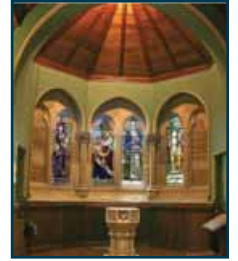

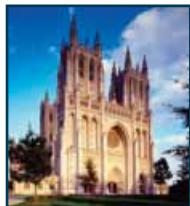
