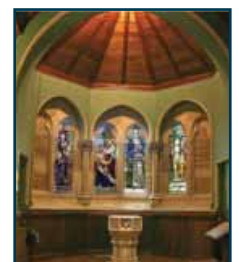

CALLING FOR WAYFARER VOLUNTEERS

On Sunday mornings they often come to the Cathedral seeking help because there are very few social service agencies open on Sundays. Through the Wayfarer Volunteer program, two Volunteers are available each Sunday to greet and meet those who seek help from us. These Volunteers provide a welcoming smile, sometimes a prayer, and a recommendation of where they can find a meal. 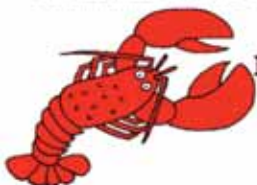

AUTOBIOGRAPHY WRITING WORKSHOP WEDNESDAYS, MAY 10, 17, 24, 31, AND JUNE 7 | 6:00 P.M. DIOCESAN HOUSE, 3700 WOODMONT BLVD. 37215

Christ Church Cathedral will offer a workshop for those interested in meeting together to discuss writing their autobiographies. Dr. Erwin Hargrove, a retired Vanderbilt faculty member, and communicant at Christ Church Cathedral, will lead the group. The workshop will meet on five Wednesday evenings at the Diocesan House from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. (May 10, May 17, May 24, May 31, and June 7). Participants will be asked to explore their early lives and reflect on their experiences in subsequent stages of life. Reflections will be evoked through discussions with respect for privacy. The purpose is to help people gain a fuller understanding of their own lives as they reflect on their experience. Dr. Hargrove has written about the lives of public figures and is familiar with studies of the life cycle in women and men. Participation will be limited to ten persons.
