SMALL STEPS - EASTER

SATURDAY, APRIL 1 | 8:30-11:00 A.M. | PARISH HALL

How can we offer more than the Easter bunny and chocolate to our children? In Advent we prepared ourselves to receive a gift from God, a child known by many names. At Christmas and into Epiphany we celebrated his birth and the recognition by both shepherds and kings, Jews and Gentiles that this baby was the Messiah, Christ our Lord. Today we are deep into Lent, preparing for the hope



and joy of the new light and life at the Easter Vigil. The Easter story often seems less approachable than Christmas. There are concrete and tough politics, angry crowds, cruelty, blood and death with the mystery of a resurrection and new life. This can seem all too real to offer to children and yet it is the greatest gift of all, the gift of God's love to us in the offering of his son for our sins. We must live into this, but how can we?

To explore the Last Supper, the meal Jesus shared with his closest friends, to look at the gift of love given to us in the breaking of the bread, to contemplate the mystery of life and death are all steps the children take in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. These are all things we as adults do or should know just as we know our ABC's, but a refresher course can be a good thing. It helps us to answer our children's deep questions and to share their spiritual lives.

On Saturday April 1, from 8:30 to 11 a.m. we will offer an opportunity for you to grow in grace and share in the spiritual journey your child is on with Jesus Christ. Bagels, fruit, juice and coffee will be offered along with fellowship at 8:30 a.m. for all. Childcare will be available in the nursery and the offering will run from 9 to 11 a.m. at the latest so you will still have the bulk of your Saturday ahead of you.

STRATEGIC PLAN IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE

Since the unveiling of the Cathedral's Strategic Plan in late January, the Implementation Committee, headed by Scott Hoffman, has begun work on certain components of the plan. Listed below are highlights of this work, each of which addresses a specific goal outlined in the plan. To view the Strategic Plan, go to http://www.christcathedral.org/about/strategic-planning/

- Pictorial Directory: Since knowing each other better is a key goal, plans are underway for a new parish pictorial directory. All parishioners are encouraged to have their photograph included in the new directory. Lifetouch photographers will be at the Cathedral April 18-23 and May 1-2. - **Dean's Forum/Small Group Ministry:** As a means of renewing and nurturing small group ministry, the Dean's Forum has launched a small group Lenten book study. Each Sunday, the larger Dean's Forum is formed into small groups of 4-5 each to discuss a particular Lenten topic.
- New Global Partnership: Bringing a new global partnership to fruition has begun with Christ Church's support of an elementary school in Boc Banique, Haiti. On Easter Monday, April 17, the Reverend Matthew Lewis and others will travel to the school to solidify our partnership with the school. In addition, the Easter offering will be designated for the school.
- Opening the Doors of the Cathedral During Weekday Business Hours: As part of the effort to enhance our ministry of hospitality, the Cathedral will extend the weekday open hours of the Nave by one hour beginning Holy Week. Going forward, the Nave will be open from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. each weekday.

Other initiatives are underway, including a new Bible study on Wednesday evenings for Young Adults; an assessment of campus facilities, including maintenance needs and the cost to address them; and an institutional readiness survey to determine the Cathedral's capacity for conducting a successful capital campaign. Additional updates will be shared at regular intervals throughout the strategic plan implementation process. Stay tuned!

AUTOBIOGRAPHY WRITING WORKSHOP

Christ Church Cathedral will offer a workshop for those interested in meeting together to discuss writing their autobiographies. Dr. Erwin Hargrove, a retired Vanderbilt faculty member, and communicant at Christ Church Cathedral, will lead the group. The workshop will meet on five Wednesday evenings at the Diocesan House from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. (May 10, May 17, May 24, May 31, and June 7). Participants will be asked to explore their early lives and reflect on their experiences in subsequent stages of life. Reflections will be evoked through discussions with respect for privacy. The purpose is to help people gain a fuller understanding of their own lives as they reflect on their experience. Dr. Hargrove has written about the lives of public figures and is familiar with studies of the life cycle in women and men. Participation will be limited to ten persons.
