PALM SUNDAY, A DAY OF CELEBRATION AND EXPECTATION

SUNDAY, APRIL 9 | 8:30 A.M. | NAVE

Palm Sunday, a day of celebration and expectation. The people in Jerusalem and even Jesus's followers thought this could be the new king!! Excitement without bounds, waving of palms, throwing down of cloaks. This is a triumphal entry. Those of us living



in the tension of knowing more of this story need to work a little harder to get that excitement back. We sometimes seem to skip this day. It is set liturgically at the top of Holy Week. From there we take a very full journey through the institution of the Last Supper. Jesus having dinner with friends offers new prayers and changes humanity forever with this greatest of gifts, the gift of himself. After dinner he goes to the garden to pray; he is with his friends but they cannot stay the course. After being arrested he works through a day of political and religious intrigue. His death on the cross is marked by the tearing of the temple curtain and the darkening of the sky. Women go to tend his grave in the garden and they recognize him when he calls them by name.

We know that all of this is coming and even more as we journey with him through the keeping of Lent into Holy Week, with Palm Sunday at the very start and ending with the new light and the risen Christ at the Great Vigil of Easter..

Palm Sunday is a little preview of all the upcoming events. This year fifth graders in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and members of Journey in Faith will be reading the gospel at the 8:30 a.m. Liturgy. They will be part of the crowd that welcomes him and so will you. After the palms are blessed and passed out, wave them in the air with hope and expectation! Remember that this is a day of celebration and join the crowd—be a lively Episcopalian!!

STRATEGIC PLAN IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE AS OF LENT 2017

Since the unveiling of the Cathedral's Strategic Plan in late January, the Implementation Committee, headed by Scott Hoffman, has begun work on certain components of the plan. Listed below are highlights of this work, each of which addresses a specific goal outlined in the plan. To view the Strategic Plan, go to http://www.christcathedral.org/about/strategic-planning/

- Pictorial Directory: Since knowing each other better is a key goal, plans are underway for a new parish pictorial directory. All parishioners are encouraged to have their photograph included in the new directory. Lifetouch photographers will be at the Cathedral April 18-23 and May 1-2. - Dean's Forum/Small Group Ministry: As a means of renewing and nurturing small group ministry, the Dean's Forum has launched a small group Lenten book study. Each Sunday, the larger Dean's Forum is formed into small groups of 4-5 each to discuss a particular Lenten topic.
- New Global Partnership: Bringing a new global partnership to fruition has begun with Christ Church's support of an elementary school in Boc Banique, Haiti. On Easter Monday, April 17, the Reverend Matthew Lewis and others will travel to the school to solidify our partnership with the school. In addition, the Easter offering will be designated for the school.
- Opening the Doors of the Cathedral During Weekday Business Hours: As part of the effort to enhance our ministry of hospitality, the Cathedral will extend the weekday open hours of the Nave by one hour beginning Holy Week. Going forward, the Nave will be open from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. each weekday.

Other initiatives are underway, including a new Bible study on Wednesday evenings for Young Adults; an assessment of campus facilities, including maintenance needs and the cost to address them; and an institutional readiness survey to determine the Cathedral's capacity for conducting a successful capital campaign. Additional updates will be shared at regular intervals throughout the strategic plan implementation process. Stay tuned!
