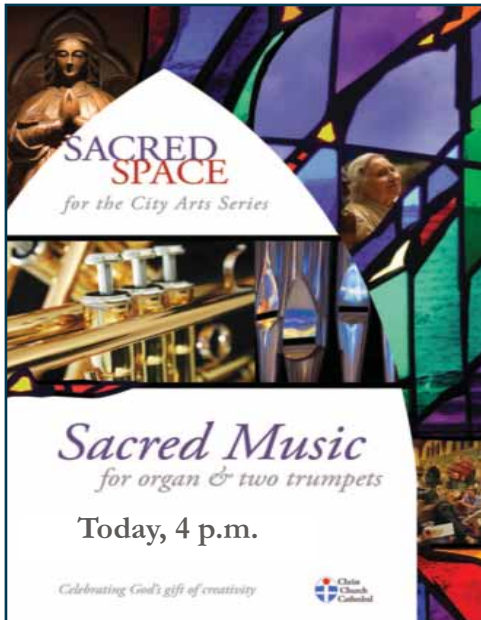

AUTOBIOGRAPHY WRITING WORKSHOP

Christ Church Cathedral will offer a workshop for those interested in meeting together to discuss writing their autobiographies. Dr. Erwin Hargrove, a retired Vanderbilt faculty member, and communicant at Christ Church Cathedral, will lead the group. The workshop will meet on five Wednesday evenings at the Diocesan House from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. (May 10, May 17, May 24, May 31, and June 7). Participants will be asked to explore their early lives and reflect on their experiences in subsequent stages of life. Reflections will be evoked through discussions with respect for privacy. The purpose is to help people gain a fuller understanding of their own lives as they reflect on their experience. Dr. Hargrove has written about the lives of public figures and is familiar with studies of the life cycle in women and men. Participation will be limited to ten persons. STRATEGIC PLAN IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE APRIL 2017

Christ Church has been busy! Moving our parish through the first phase of the Strategic Plan continues. Here is the latest news:

- **Sound System:** New speakers were installed throughout the Nave: at the front, along the sides, in the Chancel, and in the Chapel. But a sound system is more than new speakers. New amplifiers, a signal processor, and soundboard have also been added. It will take a number of weeks to get microphones and speakers fine-tuned. Over the summer, net mics will be hung from the ceiling to better capture the organ and choir. The old speaker spaces in the front wall of the Nave will be filled in and painted.
- **Capital Campaign Developmental Study:** Various components of the Strategic Plan will require additional funding apart from our annual pledge drives. A Developmental Study is underway to determine whether the capital needs outlined in the Strategic Plan can be realized. We have engaged American City Bureau to conduct the study for us. A preliminary report will be available in June.
- **International Partnership:** Look for filmed updates, via Facebook, from the Reverend Matthew Lewis and others, who recently traveled to Boc Banique, Haiti to visit the elementary school started by Pere Noé Bernier. As you may recall, our Easter offering was designated for the school.
- **Pictorial Directory:** Procrastinators, get going! Lifetouch was here April 18-23 to photograph parishioners for the new pictorial directory. 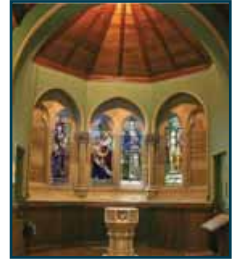

"RECLAIMING HOPE THROUGH REMEMBERING:" A MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR THE VICTIMS OF LYNCHING IN DAVIDSON COUNTY

The Episcopal Church of Tennessee, in collaboration with Lipscomb University's Christian Scholars Conference, will conduct a sacred service memorializing the victims of lynching (1879-1924) in Davidson County, Tennessee. The service will be held at 9 a.m. on June 7, in Fisk Memorial Chapel, on the campus of Fisk University, 1000 17th Avenue North 37208. Nontombi Naomi Tutu, daughter of Bishop Desmond Tutu and local race and gender justice activist and Episcopalian, will be the guest speaker. Music will be provided by the acappella group "Just Us". At the conclusion of the service, a permanent historical marker listing the names of the lynched will be dedicated on the campus of St. Anselm's Episcopal Church at 2008 Meharry Blvd 37208. Following the service, refreshments and workshops on racial justice, a formal dinner and a keynote speech by Dr. James H. Cone from Union Theological Seminary will be open to registered local participants for a \$20 charge. To register for the event go to <https://secure.lipscomb.edu/csc/memorial-pilgrimage>
