THE DEAN'S FORUM THE ORIGINS OF HAPPINESS

FACILITATOR: DR. JOHN LACHS
TODAY, MAY 14, AND MAY 21 | 9:45 A.M. | PARISH HALL

Dr. John Lachs is Centennial Professor of Philosophy Emeritus at Vanderbilt University. His philosophical interests have centered on human natures, taking him into metaphysics, philosophy of mind, political philosophy, and medical and business ethics.



Dr. Lachs was born in Budapest, Hungary, and immigrated to Canada as a child. He earned a B.A. and M.A. from McGill University in Montreal and a Ph.D. from Yale University. In 1967 he joined the Vanderbilt faculty, where he received several awards for teaching, including the Graduate Teaching Award (2000), the Outstanding Commitment to Teaching Freshmen Award (1999), and the Madison Sarratt Prize for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching (1972). His style is highly accessible, as Dr. Lachs is committed to making philosophical questions and their discussion come within the grasp of all his audiences.

Dr. Lachs will be the facilitator for the Dean's Forum today, May 14, and May 21 at 9:45 a.m. in the Parish Hall. His theme will be "The Origins of Happiness, with three lectures titled Happiness...Getting What We Like" (Part I); "Happiness...Liking What We Get" (Part II); and "Happiness...A Full Life" (Part III).

SUMMER MISSION T-SHIRT

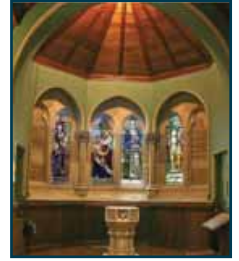

STRATEGIC PLAN IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE: MAY 2017

Christ Church has been busy! Moving our parish through the first phase of the Strategic Plan continues. Here is the latest news:

- **Sound System:** New speakers were installed throughout the Nave: at the front, along the sides, in the Chancel, and in the Chapel. But a sound system is more than new speakers. New amplifiers, a signal processor, and soundboard have also been added. It will take a number of weeks to get microphones and speakers fine-tuned. Over the summer, new mics will be hung from the ceiling to better capture the organ and choir. The old speaker spaces in the front wall of the Nave will be filled in and painted.
- **Capital Campaign Developmental Study:** Various components of the Strategic Plan will require additional funding apart from our annual pledge drives. A Developmental Study is underway to determine whether the capital needs outlined in the Strategic Plan can be realized. We have engaged American City Bureau to conduct the study for us. A preliminary report will be available in June.
- **International Partnership:** Look for filmed updates, via Facebook, from the Reverend Matthew Lewis and others, who recently traveled to Boc Banique, Haiti to visit the elementary school started by Pere Noé Bernier. As you may recall, our Easter offering was designated for the school.
- **Pictorial Directory:** Lifetouch photographers were here April 18-23 and May 1-4 to photograph parishoners for the new pictorial directory. Many thanks to all who participated!

“RECLAIMING HOPE THROUGH REMEMBERING”: A MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR THE VICTIMS OF LYNCHING IN DAVIDSON COUNTY

The Episcopal Church of Tennessee, in collaboration with Lipscomb University’s Christian Scholars Conference, will conduct a sacred service memorializing the victims of lynching (1879-1924) in Davidson County, Tennessee. The service will be held at 9 a.m. on June 7, in Fisk Memorial Chapel on the campus of Fisk University, 1000 17th Avenue North 37208. Nontombi Naomi Tutu, daughter of Bishop Desmond Tutu and local race and gender justice activist and Episcopalian, will be the guest speaker. Music will be provided by the a cappella group “Just Us”. At the conclusion of the service, a permanent historical marker listing the names of the lynched will be dedicated on the campus of St. Anselm’s Episcopal Church at 2008 Meharry Blvd 37208. Following the service, refreshments and workshops on racial justice, a formal dinner and a keynote speech by Dr. James H.
