A graduate of Clare College, University of Cambridge, England and the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, Simon won first prize and the audience prize at the 2013 St Albans International Organ Competition. Recent performance venues include Notre Dame Cathedral, Paris; King's College, Cambridge and the International Performing Arts Center in Moscow.

Simon's debut CD, *Parthenia Nova*—the first recording of the first American-built pipe organ in London—has been praised as "an excellent recording that presents an interesting range of ancient and modern music on an exquisite new instrument...Jacobs' playing is masterful throughout." Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament

All kneeling, the Blessed Sacrament in the Monstrance is exposed; then the following hymn is sung by the Choir.

O salutaris hostia

Gioacchino Rossini (1792-1868)

O salutaris Hostia, quae caeli pandis ostium, bella premunt hostilia, da robur fer auxilium. O saving Victim, opening wide the gate of Heaven to us below; our foes press hard on every side; your aid supply; your strength bestow.

After a period of silent adoration of the Sacrament, the following hymn is sung by the Choir.

Tantum ergo

Déodat de Séverac (1873-1921)

Tantum ergo Sacramentum veneremur cernui, et antiquum documentum novo cedat ritui. Praestet fides supplementum sensuum defectui.

Genitori, Genitoque laus et jubilatio, salus, honor, virtus quoque sit et benedictio, procedenti ab utroque comparsit laudatio. Amen. Down in adoration falling, Lo! the sacred Host we hail, Lo! o'er ancient forms departing newer rites of grace prevail; Faith for all defects supplying, where the feeble senses fail.

Let us pray: O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament has left us a perpetual Memorial of Thy Passion: Grant us, we beseech Thee, so to venerate the Sacred Mysteries of Thy Body and Blood, that we may ever perceive within ourselves the fruit of Thy redemption; who livest and reignest, world without end.

Amen.

The Officiant then goes to the Altar and with the Monstrance makes the sign of the Cross over the people as the thurifer censes the Blessed Sacrament and the server rings the bell. The people may make the sign of the Cross and bow in adoration, saying silently

Blesséd, praised and adored be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament.

The Monstrance is placed on the Altar and the Divine Praises are said, all kneeling. Each phrase is said first by the Officiant and repeated by the people.

Blesséd be God.

Blesséd be His Holy Name

Blesséd be Jesus Christ, true God and true Man.

Blesséd be the Name of Jesus.

Blesséd be His Most Sacred Heart.

Blesséd be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blesséd be God the Holy Ghost, the Comforter.

Blesséd be the Great Mother of God, Mary most Holy.

Blesséd be Saint Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Blesséd be God in His Angels and in His Saints.

The Blessed Sacrament is reposed in the Tabernacle. The people stand.
