The Episcopal Church of Tennessee, in collaboration with Lipscomb University's Christian Scholars Conference, will conduct a sacred service memorializing the victims of lynching (1879-1924) in Davidson County, Tennessee. The service will be held at 9 a.m. on June 7, in Fisk Memorial Chapel on the campus of Fisk University, 1000 17th Avenue North 37208. Nontombi Naomi Tutu, daughter of Bishop Desmond Tutu and local race and gender justice activist and Episcopalian, will be the guest speaker. Music will be provided by the a cappella group "Just Us". At the conclusion of the service, a permanent historical marker listing the names of the lynched will be dedicated on the campus of St. Anselm's Episcopal Church at 2008 Meharry Blvd 37208. STRATEGIC PLAN IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE: MAY 2017

Christ Church has been busy! Moving our parish through the first phase of the Strategic Plan continues. Here is the latest news:

- **Sound System:** New speakers were installed throughout the Nave: at the front, along the sides, in the Chancel, and in the Chapel. But a sound system is more than new speakers. New amplifiers, a signal processor, and soundboard have also been added. It will take a number of weeks to get microphones and speakers fine-tuned. Over the summer, new mics will be hung from the ceiling to better capture the organ and choir. The old speaker spaces in the front wall of the Nave will be filled in and painted.
- **Capital Campaign Developmental Study:** Various components of the Strategic Plan will require additional funding apart from our annual pledge drives. A Developmental Study is underway to determine whether the capital needs outlined in the Strategic Plan can be realized. We have engaged American City Bureau to conduct the study for us. A preliminary report will be available in June.
- **International Partnership:** Look for updates, via Facebook, from the Reverend Matthew Lewis and others, who recently traveled to Boc Banique, Haiti to visit the elementary school started by Pere Noé Bernier. As you may recall, our Easter offering was designated for the school.
- **Pictorial Directory:** Lifetouch photographers were here April 18-23 and May 1-4 to photograph parishioners for the new pictorial directory. Many thanks to all who participated!

KNITTERS AND CROCHETERS NEEDED FOR THE PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY

The Prayer Shawl ministry was started last August by the Reverend Canon Gene Manning and Sharon Rollins as a spin-off of the Guild of the Christ Child’s ministry of providing hand-knitted baby blankets to newborns in the parish. To date, 31 shawls have been made for the very ill and parishioners in nursing homes. A priest takes the shawl to the patient. Shawls may be made in any color and do not have fringe, which can get caught in the wheels of a wheelchair. They are large enough to cover the shoulders and the lap/knees, and in some cases can extend to the feet. One recipient wrote, “My legs and feet get so cold your shawl is just perfect to give me warmth.” Another said she felt she was wrapped in the warmth and love of the Christ Church Cathedral community
