NEW SUMMER CLASS! Our seminarian intern for the summer, Erica Ridderman, will be teaching a class on the doctrine of creation, a deeply historical (yet exciting!) Christian belief with wide-ranging implications. It has the power to shape our views of the world, God, ourselves, and the meaning of it all. In five sessions, we'll discuss how God's creation from nothing relates to scripture, theology, and the current environmental crisis. It will be a fun time of learning together. EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY (EfM)

Education for Ministry (EfM) is a course created by the University of the South School of Theology at Sewanee that invites participants to study scripture, theology, and church



history and tradition. Within a small group setting, each individual explores the part he or she is meant to play in the fullness of God's world. Members of Christ Church Cathedral facilitate the classes, which meet once a week over the course of the school year for study, conversation, and reflection. Classes meet on Tuesday evening or Wednesday morning, but a third class may be added if there is sufficient interest. Although the course offers four years, students sign up for one year at a time, and enrollment for 2017-2018 is currently open. The registration deadline is August 1, but since space is limited, those interested in participating are encouraged to register as soon as possible. A BRIEF TESTIMONY OF A FIRST-YEAR PARTICIPANT IN EfM

Initially I was unclear about what the experience of participating in EfM would mean to me. I found the class challenging, educational and spiritually uplifting. The most challenging facet of the course was the amount of reading which is required. We read lengthy tracts of the Bible, supplementary books and a course guide book. I was spiritually enriched by the class as I learned to be thoughtful and open regarding the reading, the discussions and the commentary of my fellow participants. In the EfM format, all four levels meet together once a week. At each session, the 1st year students through the 4th year students discuss their differing reading assignments. This process of in-depth discussion and reflection results in shared knowledge and an experience of fellowship. As the weeks went by, our group became closer as we walked along the path seeking to know God and one another. EfM has been a deeply felt spiritual journey for me. I encourage everyone to consider taking this path of religious education. The mentors are highly skilled and make every session interesting and joyful for all involved.

GROW IN LOVE AND KNOWLEDGE

THE CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD TRAINING

Coming this fall, parishioners at Christ Church Cathedral and the faithful from other churches will have an amazing opportunity to grow both spiritually and theologically. We spend a lot of time and effort becoming educated members of society. Occasionally we spend some time becoming educated Christians. Our parish-wide Lenten book encouraged us to redirect our lives. Should we be spending a little more time learning about the gift God has given us, saying thank you and living lives of gratitude and joy? Can our balance and even perception of our lives be rearranged? St. George's is going to offer a Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level I training; the Cathedral will offer Levels II and III. The Level II class will be on Wednesday nights from 6 to 8 p.m. in the Cathedral Annex Building starting in mid-August. Chris Hansen and Rachel Barden are the certified leaders. The Level III class will have Donna Turner as the leader from Memphis. She will come for four weekends over a thirteen-month time frame. All are encouraged to audit a class to simply grow in knowledge and love. *'The Book of Common Prayer, the Bible, and our Liturgy* are resources that we use to better respond to the gift that God has and is giving us in his son Jesus Christ.' We are able to offer a reduced price to parishioners. If you are a parishioner and feel called to take a class for the purpose of teaching, the Cathedral will cover the cost in full for you.

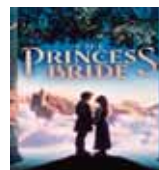

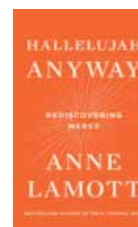

CHRIST CHURCH CATHEDRAL SUMMER READING IDEAS

Do you have a pile of books on your bedside table waiting to be read? The Adult Education Committee asked the Dean what his literary picks are for summer reading. His stack includes *Music at Midnight: The Life and Poetry of George Herbert* by John Drury, *The Holy Longing: The Search for a Christian Spirituality* by Ronald Rolheiser and *The Passion* by Marcus Hummon and the Reverend Becca Stevens. For those of you desiring deeper insight into the religious poet George Herbert (1593-1633), the biography *Music at Midnight* might fit the bill. If a theologically rich book intrigues you, you might want to pick up *The Holy Longing*. Author Ronald Rolheiser probes the question, "What is spirituality" using examples and stories relevant to today. For a quick read with some local connections, *The*



Passion would be a great choice. Authored by the Reverend Becca Stevens and her husband Marcus Hummon, it is about the cantata Hummon wrote with a grant from Christ Church Cathedral. The book includes musical history and theological reflection. The Adult Education Committee would like to commend two books: *Jane Crow: The Life of Pauli Murray* by Rosalind Rosenberg and *Hallelujah*

Anyway: Rediscovering Mercy by Anne Lamott. *Jane Crow* is a biography about Pauli Murray, a lawyer who played pivotal roles in the civil rights and women's movements and who was the first African American woman to be ordained an Episcopal priest in the United States. *Hallelujah Anyway* is Lamott's most recent book. It explores themes of mercy, purpose, kindness, and forgiveness.
