

2017 FALL SYMPOSIUM REFUGEE FAITH: DISPLACEMENT, HOMECOMING, AND GOD'S HEART FRIDAY, OCTOBER 6 AND SATURDAY, OCTOBER 7

The fall symposium will feature Dr. C. Melissa Snarr, Associate Dean for Academic Affairs and Associate Professor of Ethics and Society, Vanderbilt Divinity School.



The international refugee crisis and the unfolding national debate over for whom

and how we provide sanctuary provides the backdrop for Dr. Snarr's weekend series about how biblical stories of refugees teach us about the nature and purposes of God. Drawing on her research on interfaith activism for immigrants and refugees, Dr. Snarr offers theologically rich and strategically insightful suggestions for what it means to recognize ours as a "refugee faith" and live our common call accordingly. Dr. Snarr's research focuses on the intersection of religion, social change, and political ethics. As a Christian social ethicist, she draws on a variety of methodologies, with special concentration in sociological and political theory as well as comparative religious ethics to understand how religion transforms the world. Dr. Snarr seeks to bridge the worlds of religious activists and academic ethicists to deepen the understanding of religious traditions and practices in order to enhance the work for justice.


