NEW FORMATION MINISTRY FOR TODDLERS

More than 20 years ago, a small group of parents heard about a new way of forming children as Christians. Week by week and then slowly over the course of time, this became what we know today as Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, serving over 100 children in our parish every year. The fruit of this effort can clearly be seen. Christ Church Cathedral has even become a center for national training.



Just over a year ago, a group of parents had some questions and thoughts about the children in our nursery. Continuing Education time was spent in Virginia learning about new work being done with toddler formation. As Prayer Book people, we believe strongly that all baptized members of Christ are all in the process of formation. This belief takes us through the whole spectrum of our lives. This fall a new ministry was introduced in our nursery. A committed set of parents has volunteered and been trained to present a time of formation once a month for our youngest children. This is fifteen minutes of singing, praying, and hearing from the Bible. Children at this age are full of joy and adoration and this is expressed clearly in this simple yet profound time together.

Our prayer is that we can offer this time of worship and joy every Sunday, all year long. In 20 years, I hope we look back at this beginning with joy. To do that we need to grow as the mustard seed grew. To do this, we need parents and grandparents to take a short training and to offer fifteen minutes on an occasional basis before they go on to their regular Sunday morning Adult Formation classes.
