ECUMENISM BEGINS WITH HOSPITALITY AND PRAYER

This weekend Christ Church Cathedral welcomed over two dozen catechists from other states and a variety of denominations for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level III Training. We prayed, talked, studied, and feasted together. Gracious host families from the Cathedral opened up their homes to offer hospitality to those traveling to Nashville.

This is a Level III course so they already know from Level I that Jesus loves us, cares for us, and gives us what we need as seen in the parable of the Good Shepherd. We also have understood the moral development and growth that comes with recognition and confession of sin through the love and guidance of the Holy Spirit in Level II. This is developed in the parable of the True Vine as told by Jesus at the Last Supper. So in Level III, the God who created us, breathed life into us, and has a plan is studied through the accounts we have been given in the Old Testament. We use a theological structure called "typology." According to the Google dictionary, typology is the "study and interpretation of types and symbols, especially in the Bible". The seminal lessons we look at are used by all of our churches in the Easter Vigil, that most holy and sacred of nights when Christ broke the bonds of death and rose victorious. This is heady material and as we take it in and pass it on to your children, they will be formed as Christians who know that Jesus loves, the Holy Spirit guides, and God has a plan for each and all of us.
