THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

SUNDAY, JANUARY 28 | 10:45 A.M. | NAVE

The Annual Parish Meeting on January 28 will begin at 10:45 a.m. following the 9:30 a.m. Liturgy. Come and vote for the Vestry class of 2021, hear the Treasurer's Report for year-end 2017 and the 2018 budget, the report on the state of the Endowment, and reports from the Strategic Plan Implementation Committee, the Finance Committee, and the Campus Concerns Committee. Also hear a progress report with conceptual drawings on the capital improvement of the Christ Church Cathedral campus, with a chance for you to engage in discussion about the future of Christ Church Cathedral.

STRATEGIC PLAN IMPLEMENTATION COMMITTEE PRESENTATION

On Sunday, January 28, the Implementation Committee will provide an update to the parish regarding the capital implications of the Strategic Plan. Conceptual drawings have been developed, which imagine both new construction and renovation to accommodate fellowship space, Youth meeting space, and a staging area for Outreach ministries. Additionally, objectives and a timeline for a Capital Campaign will be presented. There will be time for small group discussion as well. The results of your observations and feedback will be factored into the final decision-making by the Vestry in the next two months.

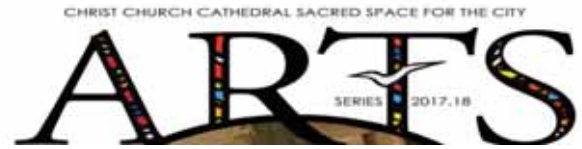
