

PRESENTING GIFTS

Today we are presenting the tins and mite boxes that you have been filling up since the beginning of Advent for Ms. Cheap's Penny Drive. Candlemas was on Friday, as was Groundhog's Day. This is certainly the year of the sacred and secular coinciding. What if Candlemas was put on a repeat loop like the day in Bill Murray's movie of the same name? What is Candlemas and what difference would that make? It is the feast of the Presentation. It is the day we celebrate the fact that Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus, following the law, to the temple 40 days after his birth. This was traditional action for every Jewish family, but it took on special significance as Jesus was presented and then acknowledged by Simeon and Anna in the Old meeting the New. The gift of Jesus incarnate being given once for all for our sins is a gift given over and over again each time we come to the altar rail.

Mary and Joseph brought their firstborn, their first fruits to the Temple, but what do we offer? In a simple way, we offer service and today we offer these collections. We have all been putting change and more into our tins and mite boxes to help Second Harvest feed the hungry in Nashville. By feeding the hungry and caring for the widow and orphan, we do our small bit to bring about the Kingdom of God, we respond to the gift that has been given to us in Christ.

LENTEN STUDY 2018

During the Season of Lent, Christ Church Cathedral will offer two opportunities to study the writings of the Reverend Dr. Howard Thurman. Please join us for one or both and bring a friend! Howard Thurman was an African-American author, philosopher, theologian, educator, preacher, poet, and civil rights leader known for his ethical and cultural criticism. Thurman's theology of radical nonviolence shaped a generation of civil rights activists, including the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Thurman served as Dean at Howard University and Boston University, and he co-founded the first major interracial, interdenominational church in the United States. His embrace of wisdom from other religious traditions, including Hinduism and Buddhism, emboldened interfaith cooperation and understanding. In his seminal work, *Jesus and the Disinherited*, Thurman provided an interpretation of the New Testament gospels that laid the foundation for a nonviolent civil rights movement.

Sundays, February 18, 25, and March 4, 11, and 18, the Dean's Forum with Father Timothy will study the *Forty Days With Howard Thurman*.
