ASH WEDNESDAY

February 14 | 7:00 a.m., 12:15 p.m., and 6:00 p.m. | Nave

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, when we begin a time of reflection, self-examination, and spiritual redirection. Lent originated in the very earliest days of the Church as preparation for Easter, when the



faithful rededicated themselves and when converts were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. Jesus was sent by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness for 40 days to prepare for his ministry. By observing Lent, we join Jesus on his fast in the wilderness as we consider our mortality and dependence on God. During the Liturgy, the foreheads of worshipers are marked with an ashen cross. Being marked with a cross symbolizes that the person belongs to God. This is in imitation of the mark with chrism that is put on in baptism, when we are "marked as Christ's own forever." The ashes are traditionally made from palm fronds from the previous year's Palm Sunday observance.

RITE OF RECONCILIATION

The third graders in our parish in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd have a special opportunity to grow in grace. They come together over five Sundays to read and meditate on scripture and to pray for themselves and others. They read and talk about Jesus's parables of love, forgiveness, and joy. During a day-long retreat, at the end of the five weeks, they each talk with a priest about



where in their lives they haven't used the gifts that have been given them and what gifts they have used well. They have the opportunity to say "I'm sorry" and to be changed by Jesus' love of them as expressed through the priest as an absolution. At the Eucharist on that day, they celebrate with Jesus and each other the forgiveness of those sins. There are two gifts that we look at, confession and communion. God created an amazing world and then he even sent Jesus to redeem us, to make it right again. Anyone can tell you where they have fallen short, not made the right choices, allowed evil and sin to grow. Our world and each of us individually have been given numerous gifts. We often do not use these gifts as we should; sometimes we do not use them at all. Being able to say "I'm sorry" is a great relief. Saying this in the context of Jesus's abiding love and care is truly wonderful. It is a form of saying 'thank you' for the gifts we have been given. Coming together to share the Eucharist, to be in communion with Jesus and each other, is a joyous occasion.

Starting today, please pray for this year's class of third graders, their families, and the catechists joining with them in this process.
