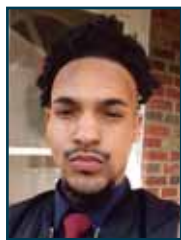

THE CATHEDRAL WELCOMES KEVIN ANTONIO SMALLWOOD AS OUR NEW SEMINARIAN

Kevin Antonio Smallwood is a seminarian at The School of Theology at Sewanee: The University of the South, where he is working toward his Masters in Divinity. He was sent by the Right Reverend Dr. Douglas John Fisher from the Diocese of Western Massachusetts, where he served two years at Christ Church Cathedral, Springfield while in the Episcopal Service Corps (ESC). While at Christ Church Springfield, Kevin Antonio implemented a community program called “Faith in Action/Fe en Acción”, which aimed to bridge the gap between the parish and the city in which it resides. The goal of the program was to build relationships between the two by way of stepping out of the parish and into the city through civic engagement events. “Faith in Action” speaks to Kevin Antonio’s ever-growing passion for relationship building, community engagement, and proclaiming the Good News, all of which he plans to share in his journey with us here at Christ Church Cathedral, Nashville.

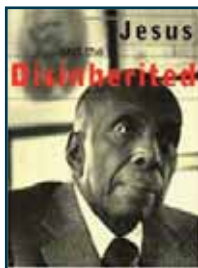

LENTEN STUDY 2018

During the Season of Lent, Christ Church Cathedral will offer two opportunities to study the writings of the Reverend Dr. Howard Thurman. Please join us for one or both and bring a friend! Howard Thurman was an African-American author, philosopher, theologian, educator, preacher, poet, and civil rights leader known for his ethical and cultural criticism. Thurman's theology of radical nonviolence shaped a generation of civil rights activists, including the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Thurman served as dean at Howard University and Boston University, and he co-founded the first major interracial, interdenominational church in the United States. His embrace of wisdom from other religious traditions, including Hinduism and Buddhism, emboldened interfaith cooperation and understanding. In his seminal work, *Jesus and the Disinherited*, Thurman provided an interpretation of the New Testament gospels that laid the foundation for a nonviolent civil rights movement.
