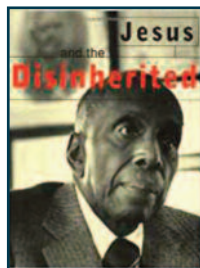

NEW EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY (EFM) CLASS STARTING IN SEPTEMBER 2018!

There are a couple of places available in a new Education for Ministry class that will begin in September 2018. EfM is a program developed by the School of Theology at Sewanee that provides lay persons with education to equip them more fully for Christian service. Throughout the academic year, participants in small seminar groups meet weekly for study, prayer, and guided reflection from a trained mentor. The goal is to learn to think theologically and grow in knowledge and faith. By examining their own beliefs and the traditions of the Christian faith, participants can learn how to be effective lay ministers in the world.
