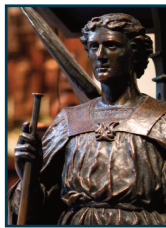

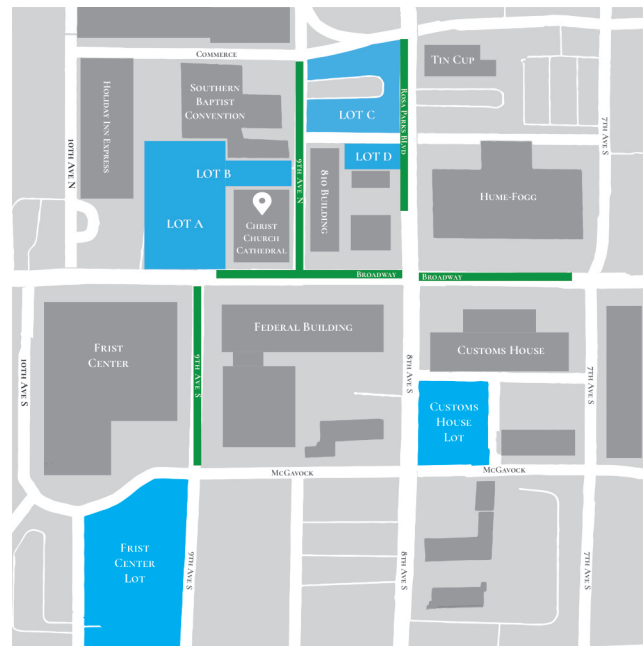

PALM SUNDAY, A DAY OF CELEBRATION AND EXPECTATION

TODAY | 8:30 A.M. | NAVE

Today the fifth graders in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and members of Journey in Faith will be reading the gospel at the 8:30 a.m. Liturgy.



They will be part of the crowd that welcomes Jesus and so will you. After the palms are blessed and passed out, wave them in the air with hope and expectation! Remember that this is a day of celebration and join the crowd—be a lively Episcopalian!!

PALM SUNDAY FELLOWSHIP GATHERING

TODAY | 9:45 A.M. | CHEEK HALL

Between the 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. Liturgies today there will be an opportunity for parishioners to gather to make palm crosses and cards for our home-bound congregants. This is also a time for fellowship and enjoying hot cross buns. Plan to join us as we enter Holy Week, which culminates in the great feast of Easter.

RECONCILIATION OF A PENITENT

MONDAY - WEDNESDAY, MARCH 26 - 28 | 11:00 A.M. - 12:00 P.M.

During Holy Week, a priest will sit inside the altar rail in the Cathedral Chapel for those who wish to make unscheduled Holy Week confessions.

TENEBRAE

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 28 | 7:00 P.M.

The Liturgy of Tenebrae, meaning “darkness” or “shadows,” has been practiced by the church since medieval times. Tenebrae is an extended meditation on Christ’s suffering. Readings anticipate the story of Christ’s Passion.

CHRISM MASS

THURSDAY, MARCH 29 | 10:00 A.M.

Every year Bishops, Priests, and Deacons gather together to renew their ordination vows before Easter. This is a prayerful opportunity to support the clergy in their various ministries. At this Liturgy, the oils used for baptism and for the sick are blessed by the Bishop and sent out to the congregations to be ready for Easter. We in the Diocese of Tennessee have beautiful oils prepared from old recipes by Thistle Farms.

MAUNDY THURSDAY LITURGY

THURSDAY, MARCH 29 | 6:00 P.M.

The Eucharist includes the ceremony of the washing of feet. Members of the congregation are invited to come forward to have their feet washed and to wash the feet of another. “By this shall the world know that you are my disciples: That you have love for one another.” (Book of Common Prayer, p. 275.)

A VIGIL WITH THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

THURSDAY, MARCH 29 | 8:00 P.M.-FRIDAY, 11:00 A.M. NAVE

Volunteers are needed to be present at this Vigil throughout the night. The Cathedral Chapel will be prepared with an Altar of Repose (for the Reserved Sacrament) following the Stripping of the Altar on Maundy Thursday. You may go online for details and sign up at <http://bit.ly/2nePB3f> or at the reception desk. A minimum of three people per hour is needed, but as many as would like can be present at any hour through the night. Volunteers at the reception desk will let those in who come during the night for prayer. Silence is kept throughout the Vigil. Candles may be lit at the close of one's time of prayer. Devotional resources for the hour will be made available in the Chapel.

GOOD FRIDAY LITURGY

FRIDAY, MARCH 30 | 12:00 P.M.

Good Friday Liturgy will be offered at noon so as to have the Cathedral's gathering conform to the historical hour of the Crucifixion. The Liturgy will include the Liturgy of the Word, Sermon, the Solemn Collects, the Veneration of the Cross, the Reproaches, and Communion from the Reserved Sacrament.

THE GREAT VIGIL OF EASTER (SOLEMN)

SATURDAY, MARCH 31 | 7:00 P.M.

The Saturday evening Liturgy, the night before the Day of Resurrection, is the Liturgy in the tradition, the Liturgy in the Book of Common Prayer, from which all other liturgies derive their meaning and purpose. Those assembled light the New Fire and by candlelight keep vigil in anticipation of the Resurrection celebration. Lessons from the salvation history of the People of God are read. Dear ones are brought to baptism, confirmation, and reception. The Paschal Shout goes up, and the first Eucharist of Easter is celebrated.

NEW BOOK FOR CENTERING PRAYER

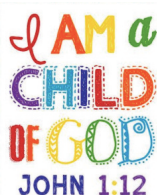

BIKE - OR - BUS TO CHURCH SUNDAY SUNDAY, APRIL 22

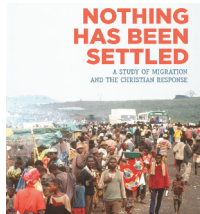

VOICES OF HOPE: THE POWER OF MUSIC
