



NOAH NEXT STEP CONVERSATIONS

NOAH's School Discipline Subcommittee has been focusing on the racial disparities in school discipline, which are the beginnings of the "school-to-prison pipeline."

The Metro Nashville Public School administration has agreed to include funding in next year's budget for training and resources for "restorative practice" and other positive discipline methods. These CAN reduce the racial disparity and keep more kids in school, being productive! HOWEVER, the Metro School Board and Metro Council still need to approve this funding!

On four evenings in mid-April, NOAH is meeting with parents, community members, and others to outline the need and the next steps to get the support needed for these important programs.
