RAÚL PRIETO RAMÍREZ, ORGAN Today, April 22 | 4:00 p.m. | Nave

Critics have called his performances "sizzling," "iconoclastic," "impeccable," and "transcendent." Raúl Prieto Ramírez is the first Spanish organist in recent times to establish himself among the eilte of the international pipe organ scene.

In December 2017, Mr. Ramírez was appointed the San Diego Civic Organist and Artistic Director of the Spreckels Organ Society, where he will preside over the famed Austin organ at



the city's Balboa Park Pavilion, the largest pipe organ in the Western Hemisphere. Mr. Ramírez is the eighth Civic Organist to serve San Diego on the Spreckels organ bench.

"The powerful personality, passionate expressiveness, gift for communication, and outstanding technique of Spanish organist Raúl Prieto Ramírez make him shine in a wide range of repertoire and styles." (Los Angeles Philharmonic)

His program will include works by J.S. Bach, Franz Liszt, Maurice Duruflé, Claude Debussy, and Sebastián Aguilera de Heredia.



VOICES OF HOPE: THE POWER OF MUSIC Wednesday, April 25 – Lecture by Joy Calico | 7:00 p.m. Wednesday, May 2 – Concert | 7:00 p.m. | Nave

This lecture and concert are part of a city-wide dialogue on the arts and social justice, presented in conjunction with the Nashville Symphony and the Violins of Hope exhibit commemorating musicians in Nazi concentration camps. These moving events will explore how music responds to



oppression, gives hope, and spurs action.

Joy Calico, Cornelius Vanderbilt Professor of Musicology at the Blair School of Music, will discuss the roles music can play during warfare and genocide in policy, resistance, and comfort.

In the concert, Portara will perform J.S. Bach's cantata "Feed the hungry with bread" (BWV 39), directed by Patrick Dunnevant, and the Nashville Concerto Orchestra will play Gorecki's Symphony No. 3 "Songs of Sorrow," Woosug Kang, conducting. The Nashville Children's Choir will also perform, directed by Madeline Bridges.

NOAH NEXT STEP CONVERSATIONS

NOAH's School Discipline Subcommittee has been focusing on the racial disparities in school discipline, which are the beginnings of the "school-to-prison pipeline."



The Metro Nashville Public School administration has

agreed to include funding in next year's budget for training and resources for "restorative practice" and other positive discipline methods. These CAN reduce the racial disparity and keep more kids in school, being productive! HOWEVER, the Metro School Board and Metro Council still need to approve this funding!

NOAH is meeting with parents, community members, and others to outline the need and the next steps to get the support needed for these important programs. The final two meetings are this week.


Customs House Lot (Directly behind Customs House @ 8th & McGavock): Please make sure your Christ Church sticker is visible; they are always available at the Reception Desk.
