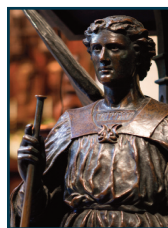

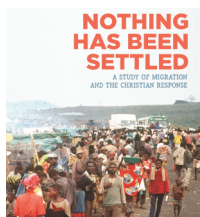

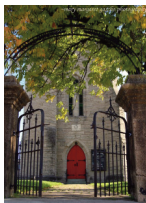

Frist Center Lot (9th Ave S): Pick up a free parking voucher at the Reception Desk during the week.

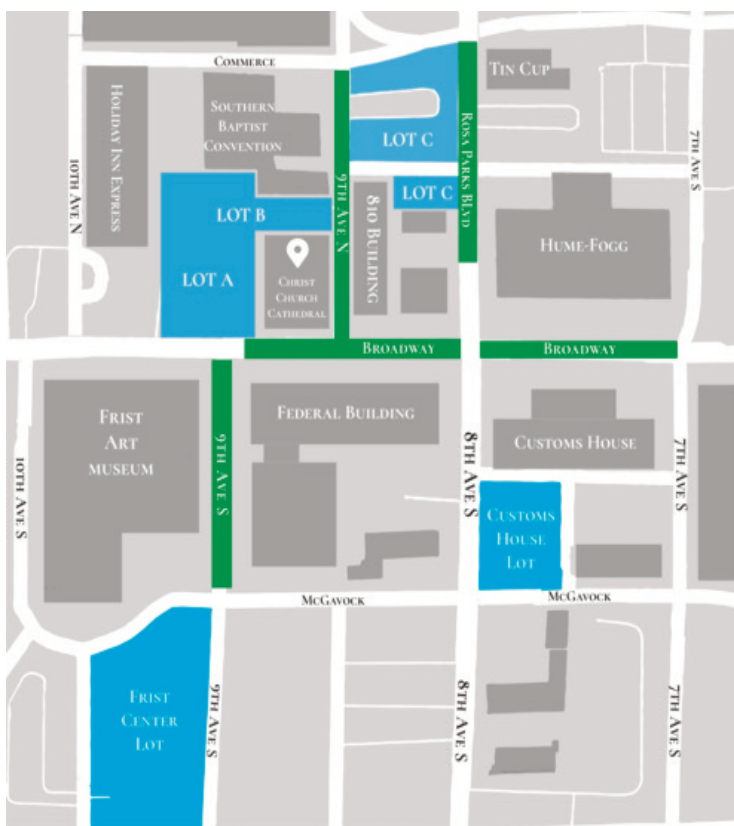
