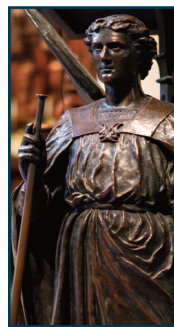

THIS 'N THAT THRIFT SHOP VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

St. Luke's Community House was founded in 1913 by the Daughters of the King in West Nashville. In 1970 an assessment showed that day care was the area's most pressing unmet need. A group of Episcopal women proposed opening a thrift shop to support the day care effort. The This 'N That Thrift Shop opened on April 1, 1971 in an old bank building on Charlotte Avenue. In 1979, the Shop moved to its current location at 51st and Georgia Avenue in the Nations. St. Luke's Day Care has become a licensed child development center, offering a highly rated kindergarten readiness program. Since 1971, a faithful group of volunteers working together at This 'N That Thrift Shop has provided a whopping \$4,414,595 to the preschool, all from sales of donated merchandise.



This 'N That performs a weekly miracle by transforming a pile of black plastic bags and cardboard boxes into a retail operation that would be the pride of any department store. The volunteers sort and price, merchandise and market, perform sales clerk and cashier duties, and perform all the functions required to continue this nonprofit business. It is truly a unique group across many churches and denominations. Volunteers have become friends drawn together by the common bond of helping others. They have also formed friendships with many of the customers they see weekly. Part of the draw is, of course, low prices, but the friendliness of the staff and their interaction with customers keeps many coming back.

How can YOU help? This 'N That has an ongoing need for volunteers to manage its six-day-a-week operation. If you can help out one day a week, that's great. If you can help out three hours one day a month or substitute on call, that's also needed. This 'N That needs men as well as women. All are welcome to join us! Come to meet new people, come to enjoy the fellowship, come to contribute to the community, come to become part of something important, come to have fun!

EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY (EFM) FALL OFFERINGS

EfM classes invite participants to study scripture, theology, and church history and tradition. Within a small group setting, each individual explores the part he or she is meant to play in the fullness of God's world.



Although the course offers four years of study, students sign up for one year at a time. The enrollment fee is \$375.00. Some scholarship money is available.

This fall Christ Church Cathedral will offer two EfM classes. A Wednesday morning class will meet from 8:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. in Room 4 in the Atrium beginning on August 29. A Monday evening class will meet from 6 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in the Wheeler Room beginning on September 10. Both classes are open for enrollment between now and August 1.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 26 | 10 A.M. | CENTENNIAL PARK

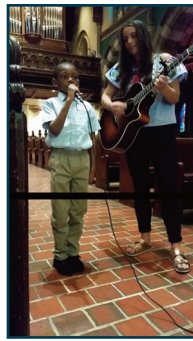
Join us for our Annual Parish Picnic at Centennial Park on Sunday, August 26, at 10 a.m. We will gather together for worship, food, fellowship, and games.

LOOKING FORWARD TO VBS 2019!

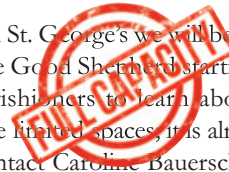
