# SUNDAY MORNING CHILDREN'S PROGRAM SEPTEMBER 9 | 9:45 A.M.

Where should my children go at 9:45 a.m. on Sunday morning for Christian Formation? What do they learn? Who teaches them? What do I need to do? These are just a few of the questions parents and grandparents have as the fall schedule starts up here at Christ Church Cathedral.



Who teaches? The lessons are presented by an adult, but they learn alongside the child, who is listening to God through the

What do they learn? How to express their love of Jesus and to follow Him where he leads. Scripture and liturgy are our primary tools.

#### Where are the classrooms?

Three year olds through first graders go to Cheek Hall. Second graders through fifth graders go to the Annex across the driveway behind the Cathedral. Sixth graders go downstairs in the 810 Building across the street.
