SEPTEMBER THANK YOU

The school year is well underway for all of our children, and routines are beginning to fall into place. This week is only the third week of the Christ Church Cathedral Sunday morning programming, but setting up routines is as important here as anywhere. Thank you for bringing your children to church and to the atrium. You are giving them a great gift in their lifelong spiritual journey. We are baptized and made members of Christ and part of the community, but we do not stop there. Just as we need to learn to read and do math problems, we need to learn to listen as we are called to grow into “the full stature of Christ.”



You can keep an eye on your children’s learning in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd in the same way you track their progress at school. On the Cathedral website, there are details for each level at www.christcathedral.org/childrens-christian-formation

The patterns of your children’s Christian formation are the same ones that apply to all of us. First, they grow in the ability to express the complete love of Jesus the Good Shepherd, who calls us by name and gives us all that we need. That complete love and care supports them as they become children filled with questions and interested in the world around them. God’s plan from Creation through Redemption and into Parousia provides a framework. Studying the gifts we have been given leads to an awareness of our world and how we interact with it. The oldest children use these building blocks to begin to figure out their place in the world. They find answers to the question of “What is my role?” and answers to Jesus’s question “Who do you say I am?”

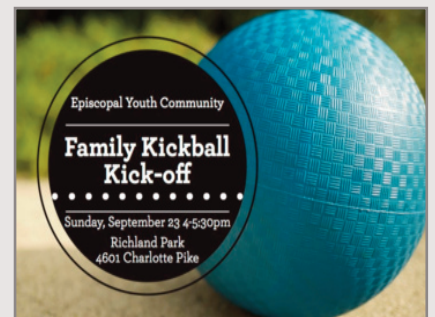

On Sunday, October 7, the Reverend Dr. Andrew Zirschky, will preach at the 8:30 and 11 a.m. Liturgies on the topic "Where Technology and Faith Collide." He will continue the discussion over refreshments beginning at 3 p.m. that afternoon. Children, youth, and adults alike are invited to participate in a full day of insightful and challenging conversations about faith in the digital age. The discussion will examine how social and mobile media are changing the ways we relate in fundamental ways. What is the call of the Christian community in a digital society and how do we live at the intersection where technology and our faith collide? Andrew Zirschky (Ph.D., Princeton Theological Seminary) is Assistant Professor of Practical Theology and Youth Ministry at Memphis Theological Seminary and serves as academic director at the Center for Youth Ministry Training in Brentwood, Tennessee.

Panelists will field questions on a variety of themes relating to faith and technology in order to offer reflections on the subject from their perspectives across different generations
