you have planted pleasant vineyards,

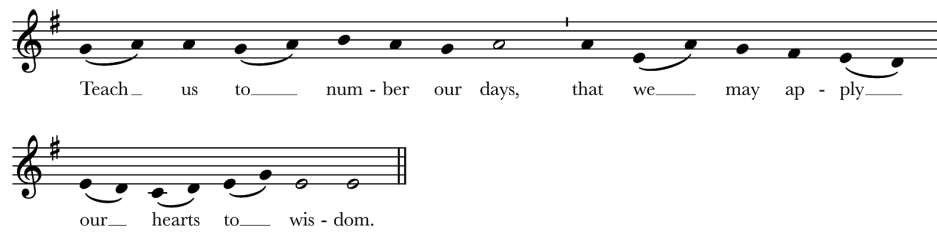
but you shall not drink their wine.

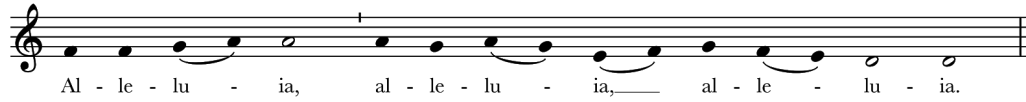
