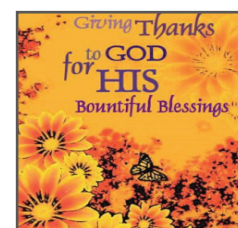
RISE AGAINST HUNGER MEAL PACKAGING EVENT TODAY | 4:00-6:00 P.M. | PARISH HALL

AN ADVENT GATHERING

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 2 | 9:45 A.M. | CHEEK HALL

The making and lighting of Advent wreaths is a lovely and old custom. The wreath is traditionally made with greens and four candles. The candles show us the progress that we are making through the four weeks of Advent, as we prepare our hearts and homes to receive the Christ Child at Christmas. When you light a candle, you can say a prayer, sing songs, or keep silence. All of these things help us to watch and wait as we prepare.



Adults, youth, and children are invited to the Advent Wreath Making in Cheek Hall on the first Sunday of Advent. Besides making a wreath, you can participate in outreach by making packets of soup mix to give to families in need through St Luke's Community House. The ornaments that we make will go on the Jesse trees that will be taken to homebound parishioners. Walking the labyrinth has become a favorite activity, as we follow the ancient prayer rituals in the center of Cheek Hall. There will be cookies, coffee, and hot chocolate, so plan to visit with your fellow parishioners. Bring your own wreath frame or purchase one from us. Fresh greenery, ribbon, and candles will all be available.
