2018 IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER

Have you taken your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) yet for 2018?

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can make a contribution to Christ Church Cathedral directly from your traditional IRA simply by instructing the plan administrator to make the transfer directly to the Cathedral as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). You are allowed to transfer up to \$100,000 a year to the charities of your choice.

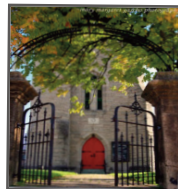
Your gift will be transferred directly to Christ Church Cathedral, will not be reported as taxable income, and will count toward your minimal distribution requirements for 2018.

RIDE SHARING MINISTRY

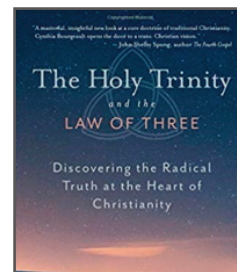
